A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO INSURANCE COVERAGE OF HEALTH SCREENINGS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. The legislature finds that some patients have
2	difficulty receiving proper screenings for sexually transmitted
3	diseases, including human immunodeficiency virus and acquired
4	immunodeficiency syndrome, at annual health screenings. The
5	legislature further finds that more than 1,200,000 people in the
6	United States are living with human immunodeficiency virus and
7	almost one in eight affected persons is unaware of the
8	infection. It is estimated that, each year, more than fifty
9	thousand cases of human immunodeficiency virus are reported with
10	one in four of the new infections striking those between the
11	ages of thirteen and twenty-four.
12	The legislature further finds that early detection of
13	sexually transmitted diseases is paramount to proper health care
14	and prevention of further transmission. The legislature further
15	finds that certain health care providers may not screen
16	specifically for some sexually transmitted diseases, including
17	human immunodeficiency virus and acquired immunodeficiency
18	syndrome, at annual screenings, even though the federal Patient

- 1 Protection and Affordable Care Act of 2010 requires health
- 2 insurance to cover those screenings without any patient cost
- 3 sharing.
- 4 The purpose of this Act is to ensure that all insurers in
- 5 the State, including health benefits plans under chapter 87A,
- 6 Hawaii Revised Statutes, provide insurance coverage for annual
- 7 screenings for sexually transmitted diseases, including
- 8 screenings for human immunodeficiency virus and acquired
- 9 immunodeficiency syndrome.
- 10 SECTION 2. Chapter 431, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 11 amended by adding a new section to part I of article 10A to be
- 12 appropriately designated and to read as follows:
- 13 "S431:10A- Human immunodeficiency virus and acquired
- 14 immunodeficiency syndrome screening coverage. (a) Each policy
- 15 of accident and health or sickness insurance issued or renewed
- 16 in this State, except for policies that only provide coverage
- 17 for specified diseases or other limited benefit coverage as
- 18 described in section 431:10A-102.5, shall provide coverage for
- 19 annual screenings for sexually transmitted diseases, including
- 20 screenings for human immunodeficiency virus and acquired
- 21 immunodeficiency syndrome.

1 Each accident and health or sickness insurer shall 2 reimburse all costs associated with the coverage under 3 subsection (a) to any physician or health care provider 4 complying with this section." 5 SECTION 3. Chapter 432, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 6 amended by adding a new section to part VI of article 1 to be 7 appropriately designated and to read as follows: 8 "§432:1-Human immunodeficiency virus and acquired 9 immunodeficiency syndrome screening coverage. (a) Each 10 hospital or medical service plan contract issued or renewed in 11 this State, except for plan contracts that only provide coverage 12 for specified diseases or other limited benefit coverage, shall 13 provide coverage for annual screenings for sexually transmitted 14 diseases, including screenings for human immunodeficiency virus 15 and acquired immunodeficiency syndrome. 16 (b) Each mutual benefit society shall reimburse all costs **17** associated with the coverage under subsection (a) to any 18 physician or health care provider complying with this section." 19 SECTION 4. Section 432D-23, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 20 amended to read as follows:

- 1 "§432D-23 Required provisions and benefits.
- 2 Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, each
- 3 policy, contract, plan, or agreement issued in the State after
- 4 January 1, 1995, by health maintenance organizations pursuant to
- 5 this chapter, shall include benefits provided in sections
- 6 431:10-212, 431:10A-115, 431:10A-115.5, 431:10A-116, 431:10A-
- 7 116.2, 431:10A-116.5, 431:10A-116.6, 431:10A-119, 431:10A-120,
- 8 431:10A-121, 431:10A-122, 431:10A-125, 431:10A-126, 431:10A-132,
- 9 431:10A-133, [and] 431:10A-140, and 431:10A- , and chapter
- 10 431M."
- 11 SECTION 5. Section 23-51, Hawaii Revised Statutes, shall
- 12 not apply to this Act.
- 13 SECTION 6. Notwithstanding any other law to the contrary,
- 14 the coverage for annual screenings of sexually transmitted
- 15 diseases, including screenings for human immunodeficiency virus
- 16 and acquired immunodeficiency syndrome, required under sections
- 17 2, 3, and 4 of this Act shall apply to all health benefits plans
- 18 under chapter 87A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, issued, renewed,
- 19 modified, altered, or amended on or after January 1, 2018.
- 20 SECTION 7. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 21 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

- SECTION 8. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2016, and 1
- shall apply to policies, contracts, and plans of health 2
- insurance issued or renewed after January 1, 2018. 3
