STATEMENT OF OBJECTIONS TO HOUSE BILL NO. 2277

Honorable Members Twenty-Eighth Legislature State of Hawai'i

Pursuant to Section 16 of Article III of the Constitution of the State of Hawai'i, I am returning herewith, without my approval, House Bill No. 2277, entitled "A Bill for an Act Relating to the King Kamehameha Celebration Commission."

The purpose of this bill is to amend the membership, mission, and purpose of the King Kamehameha Celebration Commission (Commission). This bill also authorizes the chairperson to appoint an executive director and an advisory committee.

This bill is objectionable because the specific number of Commission members was deleted from the bill, which creates a problem in determining quorum. This problem can be resolved by either restoring the maximum membership number or by providing a specific number of members for quorum in section 8-5, Hawaii Revised Statutes.

For the foregoing reasons, I am returning House Bill No. 2277 without my approval.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

Section 8-5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 1 amended to read as follows: 2 "§8-5 King Kamehameha celebration commission. (a) 3 There 4 shall be a commission to be known as the King Kamehameha 5 celebration commission placed within the department of 6 accounting and general services for administrative purposes.
