## Dear Senate President Kouchi:

An arbitration award was issued for the Hawaii Government Employees Association (HGEA) concerning Collective Bargaining Unit 14 (State Law Enforcement Officers) on February 22, 2016. In accordance with Section 89-10(b), cost items must be submitted to the Legislature. Because this award was not issued in time for costs to be included in the biennium budget, an administration proposal was submitted to the 2016 Legislature. The estimated costs are as follows:

Unit 14 is a new bargaining unit formed from employees formerly in Bargaining Units 3 and 4. Act 55, SLH 2015, provided funding to continue providing increases like Units 3 and 4, including Employer-Union Trust Fund contribution amounts. FY 16 requirements are unchanged from Act 55, while FY 17 appropriations represent an increase of about \$5.6 million.
