

A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO TUITION WAIVERS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTIO	ON 1. Chapter 304A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by	adding a new section to part II to be appropriately
3	designated	and to read as follows:
4	" <u>§304</u> 2	A- Tuition waivers; spouses and children of
5	eligible v	eterans. (a) The University of Hawaii and the
6	community	colleges of the State may waive tuition for any
7	qualified	student who is a spouse or child of:
8	<u>(1)</u>	A totally disabled veteran; or
9	<u>(2)</u>	An eligible veteran or national guard member who was
10	-	killed in action while engaged in active federal
11	<u>.</u>	military or naval service; provided that upon
12	` :	remarriage, the surviving spouse of the eligible
13	:	veteran or national guard member shall no longer be
14	, <u> </u>	eligible for the tuition waiver under this section.
15	(b)	For purposes of this section:
16	"Elig	ible veteran or national guard member" means a Hawaii
. 17	domiciliar	y who was an active or reserve member of the United

- 2 called to active duty, who served in the active federal service.
- 3 under title 10 or title 32 of the United States Code, in a war
- 4 or conflict fought on foreign soil, in international waters, or
- 5 in another location in support of those serving on foreign soil
- 6 or in international waters.
- 7 "Totally disabled veteran" means a person who is totally
- 8 disabled due to injuries received while on duty with the armed
- 9 forces of the United States.
- 10 (c) The University of Hawaii may adopt rules pursuant to
- 11 chapter 91 to implement this section."
- 12 SECTION 2. New statutory material is underscored.
