A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO MOTOR VEHICLE INSPECTIONS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that motor vehicles with
- 2 modified mufflers can be excessively noisy. State law regarding
- 3 modified mufflers has not been amended since it was passed in
- 4 1977. The legislature further finds that it is time to
- 5 reexamine this problem to find a more effective solution.
- 6 The purpose of this Act is to require motor vehicle safety
- 7 inspections to ensure that the noise emitted from motor vehicle
- 8 mufflers meets certain requirements.
- 9 SECTION 2. Section 286-28, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 10 amended to read as follows:
- "\$286-28 Suspension or revocation of permits[-]; fines.
- 12 (a) The department shall supervise and cause inspections to be
- 13 made of official inspection stations and shall suspend or revoke
- 14 and require the surrender of the permit issued to a station
- 15 which it finds is not properly conducting inspections. The
- 16 department shall maintain and post at its office lists of all

- 1 stations holding permits and those whose permits have been
- 2 suspended or revoked.
- 3 (b) Any official inspection station found to have issued a
- 4 certificate of inspection in violation of section 291-22 or 291-
- 5 24.5 shall be subject to a fine of not less than \$500 but not
- 6 more than \$1,000 or suspension or revocation of the permit, or
- 7 both."
- 8 SECTION 3. Section 291-22, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 9 amended to read as follows:
- 10 "\$291-22 Regulation of exhaust pipe and muffler. (a) It
- 11 shall be unlawful for any person to drive upon the public
- 12 highways any motor scooter, as defined in section 286-2, the
- 13 exhaust pipe or muffler of which has been so changed from the
- 14 factory design as to increase the volume or audibility of the
- 15 explosions within the motor thereof.
- 16 (b) A safety inspection required under section 286-26
- 17 shall include a test to ensure that the exhaust pipe or muffler
- 18 meets the requirements specified in this section."
- 19 SECTION 4. Section 291-24.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 20 amended to read as follows:

"[+]\$291-24.5[+] Motor vehicle muffler. (a) No person 1 shall use on a public highway, sell, alter, or install a muffler 2 [which will noticeably increase the noise emitted by a motor 3 vehicle-above that emitted by the vehicle as equipped from the 4 factory.] that has been changed or modified from the factory 5 6 design so as to increase the volume or audibility of the explosions within the vehicle's motor. 7 Any violation of this section shall constitute a 8 violation and shall be enforceable by police officers. The fine 9 10 for this violation shall be not less than [\$25] \$100 nor more than [\$250] \$500 for each separate offense. Any person who 11 violates the provisions of this section may be issued a summons 12 or citation for [such] the violation. 13 This section shall apply to any county with a 14 population of five hundred thousand or more. 15 (d) A safety inspection required under section 286-26 16 shall include a test to ensure that the muffler installed on a 17 motor vehicle does not increase the volume or audibility of the 18 explosions within the vehicle's motor greater than that emitted 19

by the vehicle as equipped from the factory."

- 1 SECTION 5. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
- 2 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
- 3 begun before its effective date.
- 4 SECTION 6. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 5 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 6 SECTION 7. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2015.
