

A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that Hawaii is in a
- 2 position to develop a groundbreaking process to address the
- 3 unmet oral health care needs of its most vulnerable citizens.
- 4 Significant adverse health and socio-economic conditions exist
- 5 as a result of untreated oral diseases among Hawaii's most
- 6 vulnerable populations, especially underserved children,
- 7 pregnant women, seniors, adults with chronic conditions, people
- 8 with special care needs, and ethnic minorities, including native
- 9 Hawaiians, Pacific Islanders, and Filipinos.
- 10 Inadequate oral health has a significant socio-economic
- 11 impact, including increased school absenteeism, lower
- 12 productivity, lower educational attainment, lower taxable wages
- 13 and property, and increased dependence on social services.
- 14 Moreover, poor oral health has a negative impact on the overall
- 15 health of the population that results in increased health costs
- 16 for the State.

| 17 | same sum | or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year |
| 18 | 2016-2017 | to carry out the purposes of this Act. |

of health for the purposes of this Act.
