A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HISTORIC PRESERVATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that Hawaii's unique
- 2 historic heritage is an irreplaceable asset to the State. The
- 3 preservation and enhancement of this valuable resource helps
- 4 attract visitors, in addition to the State's beautiful climate,
- 5 environment, and people. The preservation of historic
- 6 buildings, documents, photographs, and sites instills a distinct
- 7 pride in the people of Hawaii and serves as a reminder of the
- 8 uniqueness of Hawaii and its culture. Accordingly, it is
- 9 necessary to sustain, preserve, restore, and enhance historic
- 10 treasures that represent the heritage and legacy of the people
- 11 of Hawaii.
- 12 The purpose of this Act is to establish a funding mechanism
- 13 to assist in the preservation, restoration, and long-term
- 14 sustainability of the Bernice Pauahi Bishop Museum, Iolani
- 15 Palace, Washington Place, Royal Mausoleum at Mauna Ala, No. 1
- 16 Capitol District Building, and the state capitol.

1	SECTION 2. Section 103-8.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
2	amended b	y amending subsections (b) and (c) to read as follows:	
3	"(b)	The works of art special fund shall be used solely	
4	for the f	ollowing purposes:	
5	(1)	Costs related to the acquisition of works of art,	
6		including any consultant or staff services required to	
7		carry out the art in public places and relocatable	
8		works of art programs;	
9	(2)	Site modifications, display, and interpretive work	
10		necessary for the exhibition of works of art;	
11	· (3)	Upkeep services, including maintenance, repair, and	
12		restoration of works of art;	
13	(4)	Storing and transporting works of art[-]; and	
14	<u>(5)</u>	Costs related to preventive maintenance, repair,	
15		rehabilitation, or restoration of the Bernice Pauahi	
16		Bishop Museum, Iolani Palace, Washington Place, Royal	
17		Mausoleum at Mauna Ala, No. 1 Capitol District	
18		Building, and the state capitol to a condition	
19		reflecting their status in Hawaii's history and the	
20		unique heritage of the State's arts and culture;	
21		provided that:	

1	(A)	The preventive maintenance, repair,	
2		rehabilitation, or restoration project shall not	
3	•	change the design, material, or outer appearance	
4	•	of the property or change the characteristics	
5		that qualified the property for entry in the	
6		Hawaii register of historic places; and	
7	<u>(B)</u>	Moneys shall be expended for purposes of this	
8		paragraph only if moneys in the works of art	
9		special fund exceed \$, pursuant to	
10		subsection (c).	
11	(c) The	one per cent amount, which is included in all	
12	capital improv	ement appropriations, shall be calculated at the	
13	time the appro	priation bills are signed into law. The moneys	
14	shall be transferred into the works of art special fund upon		
15	availability of moneys from the appropriations. Each agency		
16	receiving capi	tal improvement appropriations shall calculate the	
17	one per cent a	mount and transfer the moneys into the works of	
18	art special fu	nd.
