A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HEALTH.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECT	ION 1. The legislature finds that community health
2	centers s	erve uninsured, underinsured, and low-income patient
3	populatio	ns with demographic complexities and co-morbidities, in
4	addition	to one-fourth of the State's medicaid members, and much
5	of the St	ate's homeless population. Community health centers:
6	(1)	Are nonprofit, community-based organizations whose
7		purpose and expertise lie in providing quality person-
8		centered health care to underserved populations and
9		areas;
10	(2)	Provide culturally and linguistically appropriate
11		health care and a broad range of integrated primary
12		care and preventive services;
13	(3)	Operate in medically-underserved areas where people
14		have limited access to other health care providers
15		because of geographic and socio-economic barriers;
16	(4)	Contribute greatly to the economies and livability of
17	V	the communities they serve; and

1 (5) Are cost-effective quality health care providers whose 2 care results in healthier patients and decreased use 3 of emergency, specialty, and inpatient services. Community health centers save the health care system \$1,263 5 per patient per year due to timely, effective care and care 6 management that reduces unnecessary emergency room, inpatient, 7 and specialty utilization. This translated to savings of more 8 than \$90,000,000 for Hawaii's medicaid program in 2013. Their 9 patient-centered delivery system features comprehensive primary 10 medical, behavioral-health, and dental services; care management 11 and enabling services that enhance access, compliance, and 12 patient engagement; and a focus on quality outcomes supported by 13 electronic health records that conform to meaningful use 14 requirements. Community health centers are smart investments 15 that result in healthier communities while still saving the 16 State money. **17** The legislature further finds that it is in the best 18 interest of the State to ensure access to primary, behavioral, 19 dental, and preventive health care for its residents, including quality, cost-effective direct health care for uninsured and 20 underinsured patients. In addition to facilitating a healthier 21

- 1 population, improving access to health care reduces state
- 2 expenditures attributable to hospital and emergency room
- 3 services for preventable injuries or illnesses.
- 4 SECTION 2. The legislature finds that the State's
- 5 federally matched medicaid and med-QUEST programs form an
- 6 essential support for underserved individuals and for community
- 7 health centers. Among the medicaid programs that need to be
- 8 fully funded are dental benefits for adults and outreach and
- 9 enrollment services.
- 10 Oral health is as important as any other physical or mental
- 11 health need, and dental diseases contribute to cardiac issues
- 12 and premature births. Unaddressed dental needs affect the
- 13 ability of individuals to obtain and keep employment.
- 14 Med-QUEST programs offer insurance options for low-income
- 15 uninsured citizens. Under the federal Patient Protection and
- 16 Affordable Care Act of 2010, such programs expanded to
- 17 accommodate additional uninsured adults. It is in the best
- 18 interest of the State to ensure that community programs reach
- 19 out to and assist individuals and families with children to
- 20 enroll in med-QUEST programs and other social support programs
- 21 for which they are eligible.

- 1 Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to provide quality,
- 2 cost-effective health care for Hawaii residents who are
- 3 uninsured, newly uninsured, underinsured, potential medicaid
- 4 enrollees, or medicaid enrollees.
- 5 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
- 6 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$4,800,000 or so much
- '7 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2015-2016 and the
- 8 same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year
- 9 2016-2017 to restore basic adult dental benefits to medicaid
- 10 enrollees. The department of human services shall obtain the
- 11 maximum federal matching funds available for this expenditure.
- 12 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
- 13 of human services for the purposes of this section.
- 14 SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the general
- 15 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$800,000 or so much
- 16 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2015-2016 and the
- 17 same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year
- 18 2016-2017 to provide outreach and eligibility services,
- 19 including medicaid and children's health insurance program
- 20 eligibility, for children, families, and individuals at
- 21 federally qualified health centers. The department of human

- 1 services shall obtain the maximum federal matching funds
- 2 available for this expenditure.
- 3 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
- 4 of human services for the purposes of this section.
- 5 SECTION 5. There is appropriated out of the community
- 6 health centers special fund the sum of \$1,000,000 or so much
- 7 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2015-2016 and the
- 8 same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year
- 9 2016-2017 to the department of health to be transferred to the
- 10 department of human services to establish health homes for
- 11 medicaid enrollees at federally qualified community health
- 12 centers as provided in the federal Patient Protection and
- 13 Affordable Care Act of 2010. The department of human services
- 14 shall obtain the maximum federal matching funds available for
- 15 this expenditure.
- 16 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
- 17 of health for the purposes of this section.
- 18 SECTION 6. There is appropriated out of the general
- 19 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$1,000,000 or so much
- 20 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2015-2016 and the
- 21 same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year



- 1 2016-2017 to provide administrative support for the health homes
- 2 program funded in section 5 of this Act. The department of
- 3 human services shall obtain the maximum federal matching funds
- 4 available for this expenditure.
- 5 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
- 6 of human services for the purposes of this Act.
- 7 SECTION 7. There is appropriated out of the general
- 8 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$6,000,000 or so much
- 9 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2015-2016 and the
- 10 same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year
- 11 2016-2017 for direct health care, which may include primary
- 12 medical, dental, and behavioral health care, for the uninsured
- 13 and underinsured patients at community health centers; provided
- 14 that distribution of funds may be on a "per visit" basis and may
- 15 include an additional per member per month quality incentive
- 16 payment that takes into consideration need in all counties.
- 17 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
- 18 of health for the purposes of this Act.
- 19 SECTION 8. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.

Community Health Centers; Appropriations; Affordable Care Act; Medicaid; Health Homes; Med-QUEST Programs; Healthcare

Description:

Appropriates funds to the department of human services to restore basic adult dental benefits to medicaid enrollees and to provide outreach and eligibility services for individuals and families at federally qualified health centers. Appropriates funds from the community health centers special fund to establish health homes. Appropriates general revenues for administrative support for the health homes program. Appropriates funds to the department of health for direct health care for uninsured and underinsured patients at community health centers. Takes effect on 7/1/2050. (SD1)

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
