A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CHAPTER 245, HAWAII REVISED STATUTES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the public health
- 2 rationale for the regulation of cigarettes and tobacco products
- 3 is well developed, as tobacco use is the single most preventable
- 4 cause of disease, disability, and death in the United States.
- 5 In addition to substantive laws in the State governing specific
- 6 aspects of tobacco production, sales, and use, Hawaii law
- 7 requires retailers, wholesalers, and dealers of cigarettes or
- 8 tobacco products to obtain a special license or permit. These
- 9 licenses and permits facilitate the enforcement of the cigarette
- 10 tax and tobacco tax law under chapter 245, Hawaii Revised
- 11 Statutes. However, the current license fee for wholesalers and
- 12 dealers is only \$2.50 a year, while retail tobacco permit fees
- 13 cost only \$20 a year. To ensure continued tobacco regulation
- 14 and enforcement of relevant tax laws, the legislature concludes
- 15 that these fees should be increased.
- 16 Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to:

T	(1)	Expand the definition of "topacco products" to include
2		any product containing nicotine that is intended for
3		human consumption;
4	(2)	Increase the license fee for persons engaged as a
5		wholesaler or dealer of cigarettes or tobacco
6		products; and
7	(3)	Increase the retail tobacco permit fee for retailers
8		engaged in the retail sale of cigarettes and other
9		tobacco products.
10	SECTION 2. Section 245-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is	
11	amended by amending the definition of "tobacco products" to read	
12	as follows:	
13	""To	bacco products" means [tobacco]:
14	(1)	Tobacco in any form, other than cigarettes or little
15		cigars, that is prepared or intended for consumption
16		or for personal use by humans, including large cigars
17		and any substitutes thereof other than cigarettes that
18		bear the semblance thereof, snuff, chewing or
19		smokeless tobacco, and smoking or pipe tobacco[+]; or
20	(2)	Any product containing nicotine, but not containing
21		tobacco, that is intended for human consumption,

1	whether chewed, smoked, absorbed, dissolved, inhaled,		
2	snorted, sniffed, or ingested by any other means, that		
3	has not been approved by the United States Food and		
4	Drug Administration for tobacco cessation or other		
5	medical purposes."		
6	SECTION 3. Section 245-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
7	amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows:		
8,	"(b) The license shall be issued by the department upon		
9	application therefor, in such form and manner as shall be		
10	required by rule of the department, and the payment of a fee of		
11	[\$2.50,] $$250,$ and shall be renewable annually on July 1 for the		
12	twelve months ending the succeeding June 30. Revenue from the		
13	license fees collected under this subsection shall be used to		
14	support smoking cessation programs in the State."		
15	SECTION 4. Section 245-2.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
16	amended by amending subsection (c) to read as follows:		
17	"(c) The retail tobacco permit shall be issued by the		
18	department upon application by the retailer in the form and		
19	manner prescribed by the department, and the payment of a fee of		
20	[\$20.] \$50. Permits shall be valid for one year, from		
21	December 1 to November 30, and renewable annually. Revenue from		

- the permit fees collected under this subsection shall be used to 1
- 2 support smoking cessation programs in the State. Whenever a
- retail tobacco permit is defaced, destroyed, or lost, or the 3
- permittee relocates the permittee's business, the department may
- 5 issue a duplicate retail tobacco permit to the permittee for a
- fee of \$5 per copy." 6

- 9 SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.

Tobacco Regulation; License Fee; Retail Tobacco Permit; Cigarettes; Tobacco Products; Smoking Cessation Programs

Description:

Expands the definition of "tobacco products". Increases the license fee for persons engaged as a wholesaler or dealer of cigarettes or tobacco products. Increases the retail tobacco permit fee for retailers engaged in the retail sale of cigarettes and other tobacco products. Specifies that revenue from the license and permit fees shall be used to support smoking cessation programs in the State.
