A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO A LAW ENFORCEMENT STANDARDS BOARD.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that it is the role of
- 2 the State to oversee and regulate those professions and
- 3 occupations that have a significant impact on society. The
- 4 legislature further finds that more should be done by the State
- 5 to provide standards and uniformity for law enforcement
- 6 statewide. A recent example was the law recently enacted by the
- 7 legislature to regulate private security guards.
- 8 Given the immense authority, such as the power to search,
- 9 arrest, and use deadly force, that the State and counties grant
- 10 to police, sheriffs, and other law enforcement officers, the
- 11 State must enact a law that certifies law enforcement officers
- 12 to ensure the highest standards of professionalism and bring
- 13 uniformity of standards throughout our islands.
- 14 Hawaii is the only state in the country without any state-
- 15 level regulation of law enforcement officers. Regulation is
- 16 left to the counties. Hawaii is only one of six states that
- 17 does not establish minimum standards required to be a police



- 1 officer and does not have any procedure for revoking a police
- 2 officer's certification for serious misconduct.
- 3 The purpose of this Act is to establish a law enforcement
- 4 standards board for the certification of county police officers,
- 5 state public safety officers, and employees of the departments
- 6 of transportation and land and natural resources with police
- 7 powers.
- 8 SECTION 2. The Hawaii Revised Statutes is amended by
- 9 adding a new chapter to be appropriately designated and to read
- 10 as follows:
- 11 "CHAPTER
- 12 LAW ENFORCEMENT STANDARDS BOARD
- 13 § -1 Definitions. As used in this chapter, unless the
- 14 context clearly indicates otherwise, the following terms shall
- 15 mean as follows:
- 16 "Board" means the law enforcement standards board.
- "Law enforcement officer" means:
- 18 (1) A police officer employed by a county police
- 19 department;
- 20 (2) A public safety officer employed by the department of
- 21 public safety; or



- 1 (3) An employee of the department of transportation or the
 2 department of land and natural resources who is
- 3 conferred by law with general police powers.
- 5 composition. (a) There is created in the department of the
- 6 attorney general, for administrative purposes only, the law
- 7 enforcement standards board, which shall consist of the
- 8 following ex officio voting members, or their designees:
- 9 (1) The chiefs of police of the four counties;
- 10 (2) The director of public safety;
- 11 (3) The director of transportation; and
- 12 (4) The chair of the board of land and natural resources.
- 13 In addition to the ex officio members, one public member from
- 14 each of the four counties shall be appointed by the governor, in
- 15 accordance with section 26-34.
- 16 (b) The board shall select a chairperson and vice
- 17 chairperson from among its members.
- 18 (c) The public members of the board shall receive no
- 19 salary, but shall be entitled to reimbursement for necessary
- 20 expenses, including travel expenses.

8	(7)	Establish and require participation in continuing			
9		education programs for law enforcement officers;			
10	(8)	Charge and collect fees for applications for			
11		certification as a law enforcement officer; and			
12	(9)	Establish procedures to revoke a certification issued			
13		pursuant to section -6(b) for serious misconduct.

1 The board may deny or revoke the certificate of an 2 applicant or law enforcement officer who fails to meet or 3 maintain the standards required under subsection (a). 4 -7 Employment of law enforcement officers. (a) After 5 June 30, 2016, no person may be appointed as a law enforcement 6 officer by any county police department, the department of public safety, the department of transportation, or the 7 8 department of land and natural resources, unless the person has 9 a valid certificate issued by the board under section **10** (b) This section shall not apply to a person employed on a 11 probationary basis, except that employment on a probationary 12 basis may not exceed the period authorized for probationary 13 employment as determined by the board." SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general 14 15 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much 16 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2015-2016 and the same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 17

2016-2017 for deposit into the law enforcement standards board

special fund.

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1 SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the law 2 enforcement standards board special fund the sum of \$ or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2015-2016 3 4 and the same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for 5 fiscal year 2016-2017 for the purposes of this Act. 6 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department 7 of the attorney general for the purposes of this Act. 8 SECTION 5. All rights, powers, functions, and duties of the department of land and natural resources, the department of 9 **10** transportation, and the police departments of the several 11 counties relating to law enforcement standards are transferred 12 to the department of the attorney general. 13 All officers and employees whose functions are transferred by this Act shall be transferred with their functions and shall 14 15 continue to perform their regular duties upon their transfer, subject to the state personnel laws and this Act. 16 No officer or employee of the State having tenure shall 17 suffer any loss of salary, seniority, prior service credit, 18

vacation, sick leave, or other employee benefit or privilege as

a consequence of this Act, and such officer or employee may be

transferred or appointed to a civil service position without the

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- 1 necessity of examination; provided that the officer or employee
- 2 possesses the minimum qualifications for the position to which
- 3 transferred or appointed; and provided that subsequent changes
- 4 in status may be made pursuant to applicable civil service and
- 5 compensation laws.
- 6 An officer or employee of the State who does not have
- 7 tenure and who may be transferred or appointed to a civil
- 8 service position as a consequence of this Act shall become a
- 9 civil service employee without the loss of salary, seniority,
- 10 prior service credit, vacation, sick leave, or other employee
- 11 benefits or privileges and without the necessity of examination;
- 12 provided that such officer or employee possesses the minimum
- 13 qualifications for the position to which transferred or
- 14 appointed.
- 15 If an office or position held by an officer or employee
- 16 having tenure is abolished, the officer or employee shall not
- 17 thereby be separated from public employment, but shall remain in
- 18 the employment of the State with the same pay and classification
- 19 and shall be transferred to some other office or position for
- 20 which the officer or employee is eligible under the personnel



- 1 laws of the State as determined by the head of the department or
- 2 the governor.
- 3 SECTION 6. All appropriations, records, equipment,
- 4 machines, files, supplies, contracts, books, papers, documents,
- 5 maps, and other personal property heretofore made, used,
- 6 acquired, or held by the department of land and natural
- 7 resources, the department of transportation, and the police
- 8 departments of the several counties relating to the functions
- 9 transferred to the department of the attorney general shall be
- 10 transferred with the functions to which they relate.
- 11 SECTION 7. All rules, policies, procedures, guidelines,
- 12 and other material adopted or developed by the department of
- 13 land and natural resources, the department of transportation,
- 14 and the police departments of the several counties to implement
- 15 provisions of the Hawaii Revised Statutes which are reenacted or
- 16 made applicable to the department of the attorney general by
- 17 this Act, shall remain in full force and effect until amended or
- 18 repealed by the department of the attorney general pursuant to
- 19 chapter 91, Hawaii Revised Statutes. In the interim, every
- 20 reference to the department of land and natural resources, the
- 21 department of transportation, and a police department of any of



- 1 the several counties or the chair of the board of land and
- 2 natural resources, the director of transportation, or the chief
- 3 of police of any of the several counties in those rules,
- 4 policies, procedures, guidelines, and other material is amended
- 5 to refer to the department of the attorney general or the
- 6 attorney general as appropriate.
- 7 SECTION 8. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
- 8 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
- 9 begun before its effective date.
- 10 SECTION 9. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2015, and
- 11 shall apply to collective bargaining agreements executed on or

12 after the effective date of this Act.
