A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PERSONS WITH DISABILITIES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. The legislature finds that Act 200, Session
2	Laws of Hawaii 2012, established a joint legislative task force
3	to explore the possibility of implementing a medicaid buy-in
4	program for working individuals with disabilities based upon
. 5	Hawaii's current medicaid income and asset limits, subject to
6	approval of the federal Centers for Medicare and Medicaid
7	Services. The legislature notes that a significant portion of
8	the population in Hawaii receives federal or state benefits
9	because of disabling conditions. Moreover, current state
10	programs and policies, including state-designed medicaid waiver
11	programs, create disincentives for persons with disabilities to
12	become employed, maintain employment, or increase their
13	employment income.
14	The legislature also finds that from 2005 through 2012,
15	Hawaii was the recipient of a grant from the federal Centers for
16	Medicare and Medicaid Services for the development of a medicaid
17	infrastructure program to design and implement a medicaid buy-in

- 1 program for individuals with disabilities who are employed or
- 2 desire to become employed and purchase medicaid coverage
- 3 authorized under the Ticket to Work and Work Incentives
- 4 Improvement Act of 1999 (P.L. 106-170). Prior to 1999, other
- 5 potential federal options for the creation of a medicaid buy-in
- 6 program included the 1997 Balanced Budget Act and a waiver
- 7 pursuant to title 42 United States Code section 1115, the Social
- 8 Security Act.
- 9 The legislature further finds that it is advantageous for
- 10 economic development in the State and in the best interests of
- 11 Hawaii's citizens with disabilities to establish programs and
- 12 policies that encourage employment. It is the intent of the
- 13 legislature that all state agencies work with citizens to
- 14 identify and remove barriers to employment for persons with
- 15 disabilities. Adults with disabilities need adequate health
- 16 insurance, but options for insurance coverage are limited, even
- 17 with the federal Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act.
- 18 The purpose of this Act is to encourage individuals to gain
- 19 employment and improve their employment opportunities by
- 20 establishing a medicaid buy-in program and medicaid buy-in pilot
- 21 program for workers with disabilities.

1	SECT	ION 2. Chapter 346, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended b	y adding a new section to be appropriately designated
3	and to re	ad as follows:
4	" <u>§34</u>	6- Medicaid buy-in program for workers with
5	disabilit	ies. (a) There is established within the department
6	the medic	aid buy-in program for workers with disabilities. The
7	purpose o	f the medicaid buy-in program for workers with
8	disabilit	ies is to support employment of individuals with
9	disabilit	ies by expanding their access to medicaid.
10	<u>(b)</u>	To qualify for the medicaid buy-in program for workers
11	with disa	bilities, a person shall:
12	(1)	Be a resident of the State;
13	(2)	Be at least eighteen years of age;
14	(3)	Meet medicaid citizenship requirements;
15	(4)	Have a disability, as defined by the Social Security
16		Administration;
17	<u>(5)</u>	Be gainfully employed in either part-time or full-time
18		work; provided that all earnings shall be reported to
19		the department of labor and industrial relations;
20	(6)	Have income that does not exceed three hundred per
21		cent of the federal poverty level; and

1	<u>(7)</u> <u>H</u>	ave assets that do not exceed an amount established
2	<u>b</u>	y the department; provided that the limitation on
3	<u>a</u>	ssets established by the department shall not be less
4	<u>t</u>	han \$25,000.
5	(c) T	he medicaid buy-in program for workers with
6	disabilitie	s may have an enrollment limit as determined by the
7	department;	provided that the limit shall not be less than two
8	hundred ind	ividuals.
9	(d) T	he department may require a person participating in
10	the medicai	d buy-in program for workers with disabilities to pay
11	a premium c	r other cost-sharing charges in a manner as
12	determined	by the department.
13	<u>(e)</u> I	he department shall adopt rules pursuant to chapter
14	91 necessar	y for the purposes of this section."
15	SECTIO	N 3. The department of human services shall
16	implement t	he medicaid buy-in program for workers with
17	disabilitie	s no later than July 1, 2018.
18	SECTIO	N 4. The department of health shall establish a
19	medicaid bu	y-in pilot program for workers with disabilities to
20	support the	employment of individuals with disabilities by
21	expanding t	heir access to medicaid. The pilot program shall
22	serve one h	undred workers with disabilities who obtain

- 1 employment and, as a result of their employment, are no longer
- 2 eligible for medicaid.
- 3 The department of health shall adopt rules as necessary to
- 4 implement and administer the pilot program.
- 5 The department of health shall implement the medicaid buy-
- 6 in pilot program for workers with disabilities no later than
- 7 July 1, 2016. The pilot program shall terminate on June 30,
- 8 2018.
- 9 SECTION 5. The department of human services shall submit a
- 10 report to the legislature no later than twenty days prior to the
- 11 convening of the regular session of 2017, detailing its progress
- 12 in implementing the medicaid buy-in program for workers with
- 13 disabilities. The report shall include the department's
- 14 findings, recommendations, and any proposed legislation, and
- 15 shall specify resources needed to implement the medicaid buy-in
- 16 program for workers with disabilities. The department of human
- 17 services, with the assistance of the department of health, shall
- 18 include in the report an update on the department of health's
- 19 medicaid buy-in pilot program.
- 20 SECTION 6. There is appropriated out of the general
- 21 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$\\$ or so much
- 22 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2015-2016 and the

- 1 same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year
- 2 2016-2017 for the medicaid buy-in pilot program for workers with
- 3 disabilities who are no longer eligible for medicaid benefits
- 4 because they obtained employment.
- 5 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
- 6 of health for the purposes of this Act.
- 7 SECTION 7. There is appropriated out of the general
- 8 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much
- 9 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2015-2016 and the
- 10 same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year
- 11 2016-2017 for the University of Hawaii center on disability
- 12 studies to prepare and conduct outreach and training relating to
- 13 the medicaid buy-in program for workers with disabilities.
- 14 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the University
- 15 of Hawaii center on disability studies for the purposes of this
- 16 Act.
- 17 SECTION 8. New statutory material is underscored.
- 18 SECTION 9. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.
