

## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE HAWAIIAN ROLL COMMISSION.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Chapter 10, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended
- 2 by adding a new part to be appropriately designated and to read
- 3 as follows:
- 4 "PART . NATIVE HAWAIIAN RECOGNITION
- 5 §10-A Statement of recognition. The Native Hawaiian
- 6 people are hereby recognized as the only indigenous, aboriginal,
- 7 maoli people of Hawaii.
- 8 §10-B Purpose. The purpose of this part is to authorize
- 9 the office to provide for and implement the recognition of the
- 10 Native Hawaiian people by means and methods that will facilitate
- 11 their self-governance, including the establishment of, or the
- 12 amendment to, programs, entities, and other matters pursuant to
- 13 law that relate, or affect ownership, possession, or use of
- 14 lands by the Native Hawaiian people, and by further promoting
- 15 their culture, heritage, entitlements, health, education, and
- 16 welfare.



1	§10-	C Native	Hawaiian roll commission. (a) The office						
2	may establish a five-member Native Hawaiian roll commission								
3	which shall be responsible for:								
4	(1)	Preparing	and maintaining a roll of qualified Native						
5		Hawaiians	;						
6	(2)	(2) Certifying that the individuals on the roll of							
7	qualified Native Hawaiians meet the definition of								
8	qualified Native Hawaiians. For purposes of								
9	establishing the roll, a "qualified Native Hawaiian"								
10	means an individual whom the commission determines has								
11	satisfied the following criteria and who makes a								
12		written s	tatement certifying that the individual:						
13		(A) Is:							
14		(i)	An individual who is a descendant of the						
15			aboriginal peoples who, prior to 1778,						
16			occupied and exercised sovereignty in the						
17			Hawaiian islands, the area that now						
18			constitutes the State of Hawaii;						
19		(ii)	An individual who is one of the indigenous,						
20			native people of Hawaii and who was eligible						
21			in 1921 for the programs authorized by the						

1	Haw	aiian Homes Commission Act, 1920, or a
2	dir	ect lineal descendant of that individual;
3	or	
4	(iii) An	individual who meets the ancestry
5	req	uirements of Kamehameha Schools or of any
6	Haw	aiian registry program of the office;
7	(B) Has main	tained a significant cultural, social, or
8	civic co	nnection to the Native Hawaiian community
9	and wish	es to participate in the organization of
10	the Nati	ve Hawaiian governing entity; and
11	(C) Is eight	een years of age or older;
12	(3) Receiving and	maintaining documents that verify
13	ancestry; cul	tural, social, or civic connection to the
14	Native Hawaii	an community; and age from individuals
15	seeking to be	included in the roll of qualified Native
16	Hawaiians. N	otwithstanding any other law to the
17	contrary, the	se verification documents shall be
18	confidential;	and
19	(4) Notwithstandi	ng any other law to the contrary,
20	including in	the roll of qualified Native Hawaiians
21	all individua	als already registered with the State as

1	verified Hawaiians or Native Hawaiians through the						
2	office as demonstrated by the production of relevant						
3	office of Hawaiian affairs records, and extending to						
4	those individuals all rights and recognitions						
5	conferred upon other members of the roll.						
6	(b) If the commission is established, no later than one						
7	hundred eighty days after the establishment of the commission,						
8	the board of trustees shall appoint the members of the Native						
9	Hawaiian roll commission from nominations submitted by qualified						
10	Native Hawaiians and qualified Native Hawaiian membership						
11	organizations. For the purposes of this subsection, a qualified						
12	Native Hawaiian membership organization includes an organization						
13	that, on the day of appointment, has been in existence for at						
14	least ten years, and whose purpose has been and is the						
15	betterment of the conditions of the Native Hawaiian people.						
16	In selecting the five members from nominations submitted by						
17	qualified Native Hawaiians and qualified Native Hawaiian						
18	membership organizations, the board of trustees shall appoint						
19	the members as follows:						
20	(1) One member shall reside in the county of Hawaii;

1	(2)	One	member	shall	reside	in	the	city	and	county	of

- 2 Honolulu;
- 3 (3) One member shall reside in the county of Kauai;
- 4 (4) One member shall reside in the county of Maui; and
- 5 (5) One member shall serve at-large.
- 6 (c) A vacancy on the commission shall not affect the
- 7 powers of the commission and shall be filled in the same manner
- 8 as the original appointment.
- 9 (d) Members of the commission shall serve without
- 10 compensation but shall be allowed travel expenses, including per
- 11 diem in lieu of subsistence while away from their homes or
- 12 regular places of business in the performance of services for
- 13 the commission.
- 14 (e) The commission may fix the compensation of the
- 15 executive director and other commission personnel.
- 16 (f) The commission may procure temporary and intermittent
- 17 services.
- 18 §10-D Notice of qualified Native Hawaiian roll. (a) If
- 19 the commission is established, the commission shall publish
- 20 notice of the certification of the qualified Native Hawaiian
- 21 roll, update the roll as necessary, and publish notice of the

- 1 updated roll of qualified Native Hawaiians; provided that the
- 2 commission shall not publish or release any verification
- 3 documents of any qualified Native Hawaiian on the roll.
- 4 (b) The publication of the initial and updated rolls shall
- 5 serve as the basis for the eligibility of qualified Native
- 6 Hawaiians whose names are listed on the rolls to participate in
- 7 the organization of the Native Hawaiian governing entity.
- 8 §10-E Native Hawaiian convention. The publication of the
- 9 roll of qualified Native Hawaiians, as provided in section 10-D,
- 10 is intended to facilitate the process under which qualified
- 11 Native Hawaiians may independently commence the organization of
- 12 a convention of qualified Native Hawaiians, established for the
- 13 purpose of organizing themselves.
- 14 §10-F Dissolution of the Native Hawaiian roll commission.
- 15 The board of trustees shall dissolve the Native Hawaiian roll
- 16 commission upon being informed by the Native Hawaiian roll
- 17 commission that it has published notice of any updated roll of
- 18 qualified Native Hawaiians, as provided in section 10-D, and
- 19 thereby completed its work.
- 20 §10-G No diminishment of rights or privileges. Nothing
- 21 contained in this part shall diminish, alter, or amend any



- 1 existing rights or privileges enjoyed by the Native Hawaiian
- 2 people that are not inconsistent with this part.
- 3 §10-H Reaffirmation of delegation of federal authority;
- 4 governmental authority and power; negotiations. (a) The
- 5 delegation by the United States of authority to the State of
- 6 Hawaii to address the conditions of the indigenous, native
- 7 people of Hawaii contained in the Act entitled "An Act to
- 8 Provide for the Admission of the State of Hawaii into the
- 9 Union", approved March 18, 1959 (Public Law 86-3), is
- 10 reaffirmed.
- (b) Consistent with the policies of the State of Hawaii,
- 12 the members of the qualified Native Hawaiian roll, and their
- 13 descendants, shall be acknowledged by the State of Hawaii as the
- 14 indigenous, aboriginal, maoli population of Hawaii.
- 15 §10-I Disclaimer. Nothing in this part is intended to
- 16 serve as a settlement of any claims against the State of Hawaii,
- 17 or affect the rights of the Native Hawaiian people under state,
- 18 federal, or international law."
- 19 SECTION 2. Chapter 10H, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 20 repealed.



- 1 SECTION 3. Act 195, Session Laws of Hawaii 2011, is
- 2 repealed.
- 3 SECTION 4. All appropriations, records, equipment,
- 4 machines, files, supplies, contracts, books, papers, documents,
- 5 maps, and other personal property heretofore made, used,
- 6 acquired, or held by the Native Hawaiian roll commission shall
- 7 be transferred to the office of Hawaiian affairs.
- 8 SECTION 5. In codifying the new sections added by section
- 9 1 of this Act, the revisor of statutes shall substitute
- 10 appropriate section numbers for the letters used in designating
- 11 the new sections in this Act.
- 12 SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2015.
