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# H.B. NO. (390

#### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO MASSAGE.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Section 452-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended as follows:
3	1. By adding four new definitions to be appropriately
4	inserted and to read:
5	""Certified massage" and "certified massage therapy" means
6	massage therapy performed by a certified massage therapist, or
7	by a massage therapist assistant being supervised by a certified
8	massage therapist that includes the assessment and treatment of
9	humans to evaluate, prevent, and alleviate pain, anguish, and
10	other physical and mental diseases and disorders primarily by
11	means of massage therapy. It includes consultation, evaluation,
12	treatment, and modification of treatment.
13	"Certified massage therapist" means a person who is a
14	licensed massage therapist in the State and certified by the
15	board to practice certified massage therapy as outlined in this
16	chapter.

1 [superficial soft parts of the body,] soft tissue parts of the 2 musculoskeletal system, consisting of rubbing, stroking, 3 tapotement, guided movement, pressing, shaking, or kneading with 4 the hands, feet, elbow, or arms, and whether or not aided by any 5 mechanical or electrical apparatus, appliances, or supplementary 6 aids such as rubbing alcohol, liniments, antiseptics, oils, 7 powder, creams, lotions, ointments, or other similar 8 preparations commonly used in this practice. Any mechanical or 9 electrical apparatus used as described in this chapter shall be 10 approved by the United States Food and Drug Administration." 11 3. By amending the definition of "massage therapy 12 establishment" to read: 13 ""Massage therapy establishment" means premises occupied 14 and used for the purpose of practicing massage therapy, 15 certified massage therapy, or massage therapy training; provided 16 that when any massage therapy establishment is situated in any 17 building used for residential purposes, the massage therapy 18 establishment premises shall be set apart and shall not be used 19 for any other purpose." 4. By repealing the definition of "massage therapist 20

6	SECTION 2. Section 452-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
7	amended to read as follows:
8	"§452-2 License required. (a) It is unlawful for any
9	person in the State to engage in or attempt to engage in the
10	occupation or practice of massage for compensation without a
11	current massage therapist license issued pursuant to this
12	chapter.
13	(b) A [massage therapist apprentice who has a permit, or
14	a] massage therapist student under the direct supervision of a
15	teacher in a massage school setting, is also permitted to engage
16	in or attempt to engage in the occupation or practice of
17	massage.
18	(c) A massage therapist assistant under the supervision of
19	a certified massage therapist is also permitted to engage in the
20	practice of massage."

1 SECTION 3. Section 452-4, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 2 amended to read as follows: 3 "§452-4 Creation of state board; qualifications. (a) 4 There is established within the department of commerce and consumer affairs for administrative purposes a state board of 5 6 massage therapy consisting of [five] seven members. 7 [Three] Five members shall have at least three years (b) 8 of practical experience as licensed massage therapists [, who] 9 and shall be actively employed as massage therapists, and two 10 shall be public members. Two of the five members licensed as 11 massage therapists shall be certified massage therapists in 12 accordance with this chapter. 13 (c) Board members affiliated with any school teaching 14 massage [or any apprenticeship] or other massage therapy 15 training program shall disclose that affiliation and shall at 16 all times adhere to the provisions of chapter 84 and the 17 interpretations of that chapter by the state ethics commission." 18 SECTION 4. Section 452-6, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 19 amended by amending subsections (b) and (c) to read as follows: 20 In addition to any other powers and duties authorized "(b) 21 by law, the board may grant, or upon proof of violation of this



1 chapter or the rules adopted by the board governing the practice 2 under this chapter, revoke, suspend, or refuse to renew a 3 license or registration as provided in this chapter. 4 The board shall adopt rules pursuant to chapter 91 (C) 5 relating to massage therapist [apprenticeship and] training 6 including rules establishing qualifications for [apprenticeship 7 permits and] training programs and the requirements to be met 8 [by massage therapist apprentices] prior to taking the massage 9 therapist license examination [-] and the certified massage 10 therapist examination." SECTION 5. Section 452-12, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 11 12 amended to read as follows: "§452-12 Application for examination. Each person who 13 14 desires to practice [the occupation of] massage [therapist] 15 therapy shall file with the board a written application on a 16 form prescribed and supplied by the board, and shall submit such 17 credentials as may be required by this chapter or the rules adopted by the board, and shall also pay the board the required 18 19 fees."



10		hundred classroom hours of academic training in
11		anatomy, physiology, structural kinesiology,

13		professional development for healthcare providers.
14	<u>(5)</u>	An applicant for examination to registration as a
15		massage therapist assistant shall have completed three
16		hundred hours of academic training in anatomy, safety
17		and contraindications, sanitation, hygiene, and theory
18		and demonstration of massage which is not confined to
19		any specific system or method of massage therapy,
20		spent at least three months in training at a school
21		approved by the board, and met all other requirements



The license, certification, or 15 registration shall be evidence that the person to whom it is 16 issued is entitled to follow the practice stipulated therein as 17 prescribed in this chapter. The license, certification, or 18 registration shall not be transferable and shall be 19 conspicuously displayed in the place of business or employment." 20 SECTION 9. Section 452-16, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 21 amended to read as follows:

1	"§452-16 Renewal of license[+], certification, and
2	registration; fees. Massage therapist licenses, massage
3	therapist certifications, massage therapist assistant
4	registrations, and massage therapy establishment licenses shall
5	expire on June 30 of each even-numbered year following the date
6	of issuance unless renewed for the next biennium. These
7	licenses, certifications, and registrations may be renewed by
8	filing an application therefor, accompanied by a renewal fee.
9	The application shall be made between May 1 and June 30 of each
10	even-numbered year. Failure to apply for renewal as provided in
11	this section shall constitute a forfeiture of the license,
12	certification, or registration as of the date of expiration.
13	Any license, certification, or registration so forfeited may be
14	restored within one year after expiration upon the filing of an
15	application in the same manner and payment of a penalty fee in
16	addition to all delinguent fees. Thereafter, the person shall
17	apply as a new applicant and the board may require the person to
18	take and pass the examination and satisfy all requirements for
19	the examination, including training, if the board is not
20	satisfied that the person possesses current knowledge and skills
21	for the practice of massage therapy."





1 SECTION 10. Section 452-19, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 2 amended to read as follows: 3 "§452-19 Penalties. (a) Any person who practices massage 4 or maintains a massage therapy establishment, or acts in any 5 capacity wherein a license, certification, or registration is 6 required by this chapter, without [a license] the appropriate 7 license, certification, or registration as provided for in this 8 chapter, shall be guilty of a petty misdemeanor. 9 (b) Any owner, operator, manager, or licensee in charge of 10 or in control of a massage therapy establishment who knowingly 11 employs a person who is not licensed , certified, or registered 12 as a massage therapist or [who has not received a permit as a 13 massage therapist apprentice] a massage therapist assistant as 14 provided in this chapter, or who allows an unlicensed, uncertified, or unregistered person to perform, operate, or 15 practice massage is guilty of a misdemeanor." 16 17 SECTION 11. Section 452-23, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 18 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows: 19 "(a) It is a misdemeanor for any person, including a 20 massage therapist assistant or a person who is exempt by section 21 452-21 from this chapter, to advertise with or without any

Further, it shall be 3 a violation of this chapter for any person to advertise: 4 (1) As a massage therapist, a certified massage therapist, 5 a massage therapist assistant, or a massage therapy 6 establishment unless the person holds a valid license, 7 certification, or registration under this chapter in the classification so advertised; 8 9 (2) By combining advertising for [a licensed massage 10 therapy service] any massage service with escort or 11 dating services; 12 As performing massage in a form in which the person (3) 13 has not received training, or of a type which is not 14 licensed or otherwise recognized by statute or 15 administrative rule; 16 (4)By using in any mass distribution, print 17 advertisements such as newspaper advertisements, or 18 telephone directory listings, pictures depicting the human form other than hands, wrists, and forearms; 19 By using any term other than therapeutic massage or 20 (5) 21 massage therapy to refer to the service; or

(6) By referring to any personal physical qualities of the

3 "Advertise" as used in this section includes, but is not limited 4 to, the issuance of any card, sign, or device to any person; the 5 causing, permitting, or allowing of any sign or marking on or in 6 any building, vehicle or structure; advertising in any newspaper 7 or magazine; any listing or advertising in any directory under a classification or heading that includes the word "massage 8 9 therapist" or "massage therapy establishment"; or commercials 10 broadcast by airwave transmission."

SECTION 12. Section 452-24, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:

13 "(a) In addition to any other actions authorized by law, 14 the board may take disciplinary action against any licensee, 15 <u>certificant, or registrant,</u> including, but not limited to, 16 revocation, suspension, fine, or a combination thereof, or may 17 refuse to grant or renew a license, <u>certification, or</u> 18 <u>registration</u> for any cause authorized by law, including but not 19 limited to the following:

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 Procuring a license, certification, or registration through fraud, misrepresentation, or deceit or



1		permitting an unlicensed person to perform activities
2		which require a license under this chapter;
3	(2)	Conviction of any crime involving moral turpitude;
4	(3)	Practicing massage while the ability to practice is
5		impaired by alcohol, drugs, physical disability, or
6		mental instability;

8		registration as provided in this chapter;
9	(5)	Professional misconduct, gross carelessness, or
10		manifest incapacity in the practice of massage;
11	(6)	Violating this chapter or the rules adopted pursuant

13	(7)	Failing to comply with a board order;
14	(8)	Any other conduct constituting fraudulent or dishonest
15		dealings;
16	(9)	Making a false statement on any document submitted or
17		required to be filed by this chapter; or
18	(10)	Any representation, or the use of any designation,
19		which states or implies that the person is able to
20		perform a technique of massage which the person is not
21		trained to perform."
