A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE SUPPLEMENTAL NUTRITION ASSISTANCE PROGRAM.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Consumption of fresh fruit and vegetables is an
- 2 integral part of a healthy diet and central to the prevention of
- 3 obesity and disease. Every community should have adequate
- 4 access to such healthy dietary options; however, high cost and
- 5 poor quality often make this difficult.
- **6** To increase access to fresh fruits and vegetables for
- 7 beneficiaries of the federal Supplemental Nutrition Assistance
- 8 Program, some states have enacted farmers market matching
- 9 incentive programs. Under such programs, individuals who
- 10 purchase produce at local farmers markets using their nutrition
- 11 assistance benefits receive additional benefits on a dollar-for-
- 12 dollar basis up to a certain amount.
- The legislature finds that such programs have not only
- 14 increased access to healthy dietary options, but have also
- 15 helped invigorate local economies and address food insecurity.
- 16 Therefore, the purpose of this Act is to require the department
- 17 of human services to develop and administer a farmers market

- 1 matching incentive program for beneficiaries of the Supplemental
- 2 Nutrition Assistance Program.
- 3 SECTION 2. Chapter 346, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 4 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
- 5 and to read as follows:
- 6 "§346- Farmers market matching incentive program. (a)
- 7 There is established a farmers market matching incentive program
- 8 for beneficiaries of the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance
- 9 Program. The program shall be developed and administered by the
- 10 department. The department shall consult with the department of
- 11 agriculture in developing and implementing the program.
- 12 (b) Beneficiaries who use food stamps to make purchases at
- 13 a farmers market shall receive a dollar-for-dollar match up to
- 14 \$20. Matching moneys received shall be limited to purchases at
- 15 a farmers market.
- 16 (c) There is established within the department a farmers
- 17 market matching incentive program special account, into which
- 18 shall be deposited any legislative appropriations and any public
- 19 or private grants, awards, or gifts for the purpose of the
- 20 farmers market matching incentive program. Moneys in the

- 1 special account may be expended by the department to administer
- 2 the program and to provide matching funds to beneficiaries.
- 3 The department shall adopt rules pursuant to chapter
- 91 to develop and administer the farmers market matching 4
- 5 incentive program."
- 6 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
- 7 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much
- 8 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2015-2016 and the
- 9 same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year
- 10 2016-2017 to develop and administer a farmers market matching
- incentive program for beneficiaries of the Supplemental 11
- 12 Nutrition Assistance Program.
- 13 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
- 14 of human services for the purposes of this Act.
- 15 SECTION 4. New statutory material is underscored.
- SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2015. 16
