A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO DRUG ABUSE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that drug overdose deaths
- 2 have skyrocketed among teens and young adults in the United
- 3 States, with rates tripling or quadrupling in one out of every
- 4 three states during the past decade, according to a November
- 5 2015 report by the Trust for America's Health. The report,
- 6 entitled "Reducing Teen Substance Misuse: What Really Works",
- 7 noted that the death rate for drug overdoses more than doubled
- 8 in eighteen states, including Hawaii, and that many young people
- 9 who are addicted to prescription drugs switch to heroin because
- $10\,$ it is often cheaper and easier to access. The report also
- 11 stated that prescription painkillers were responsible for more
- 12 than half of the nation's drug overdose deaths in 2013,
- 13 accounting for 22,700 fatalities, and that young adults ages
- 14 nineteen to twenty-five are particularly at risk for a fatal
- 15 overdose. The legislature finds that these statistics point to
- 16 the need for an increased focus on early drug intervention to
- 17 prevent illegal drug use and addiction among young people.



1	Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to establish a		
2	heroin and opioid abuse task force.		
3	SECTION 2. (a) There is established a heroin and opioid		
4	abuse tasl	k force to examine the increasing threat of heroin and	
5	opioid abuse in Hawaii and potential responses to that threat.		
6	(b)	The task force shall be composed of the following:	
7	(1)	The attorney general, or the attorney general's	
8		designee;	
9	(2)	The director of health, or the director's designee;	
10	(3)	The prosecuting attorney of the city and county of	
11		Honolulu, or the prosecuting attorney's designee;	
12	(4)	A police chief chosen by the state Law Enforcement	
13		Coalition, or the police chief's designee;	
14	(5)	A member of the senate to be selected by the senate	
15		president; and	
16	(6)	A member of the house or representatives to be	
17		selected by the house speaker.	
18	(c)	Representatives from the following organizations shall	
19	also be i	nvited to serve on the task force:	
20	(1)	The Coalition for a Drug-Free Hawaii; and	
21	(2)	The Drug Policy Forum of Hawaii.	

1	(đ)	The members of the task force shall elect a
2	chairpers	on from among themselves.
3	(e)	The duties of the task force shall be to review, in
4	consultat	ion with relevant experts as necessary, and make
5	recommendations relating to:	
6	(1)	Amending statutes, including those pertaining to
7		penalties, relating to the distribution of heroin;
8	(2)	Amending statutes, including those pertaining to
9		penalties, relating to the distribution of fentanyl;
10	(3)	Requiring insurance companies to use uniform
11		evaluation criteria for substance abuse treatment and
12		removing prior authorization requirements;
13	(4)	Mandating greater use of the State's prescription drug
14		monitoring program and upgrading its technology; and
15	(5)	Continuing medical education relating to prescribing
16		schedule II, III, and IV drugs, as defined in chapter
17		329, Hawaii Revised Statutes.
18	(f)	The task force shall submit a report of its findings
19	and recom	mendations, including any proposed legislation, to the
20	legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of	

the regular session of 2017.

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- 1 (g) The task force shall cease to exist upon adjournment
- 2 of the regular session of 2017.
- 3 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.

Heroin and Opioids; Abuse; Prevention; Task Force; Established
