A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO ELECTIONS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1.	Section 11-115,	Hawaii	Revised	Statutes,	is
2	amended to read	as follows:				

3 "§11-115 Arrangement of names on the ballot. (a) The 4 names of the candidates shall be placed upon the ballot for 5 their respective offices in alphabetical order [except:]; 6 provided that:

- 7 (1) Prior to each election cycle, the chief election
 8 officer shall select a letter of the alphabet by lot;
- 9 <u>and</u>
- 10 (2) For primary, general, and special elections during
- 11 each election cycle, candidates whose last names begin
- 12 with the letter selected pursuant to paragraph (1)
- 13 shall be placed first upon the ballot and the names of
- 14 other candidates shall follow in alphabetical order,
- 15 beginning with the letter that follows the letter

16 <u>selected by lot.</u>



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1	The chief election officer shall inform voters, by a method				
2	suited for the voting system, that the candidates may not				
3	necessarily be listed on the ballot in alphabetical order.				
4	(b) In addition to the requirement of subsection (a),				
5	arrangement of candidate names on a ballot shall be:				
6	(1) As provided in section 11-118;				
7	(2) [For] <u>Subject to</u> the limitations of the voting system				
8	in use; and				
<u>9</u>	(3) [For] In the case of the candidates for vice president				
10	and lieutenant governor in the general election				
11	[whose], the names of those candidates shall be placed				
12	immediately below the name of the candidate for				
13	president or governor of the same political party.				
14	$\left[\frac{b}{c}\right]$ (c) In elections using the paper ballot or				
15	electronic voting systems where the names of the candidates are				
16	printed and the voter records the voter's vote on the face of				
17	the ballot, the following format shall be used: A horizontal				
18	line shall be ruled between each candidate's name and the next				
19	name, except between the names of presidential and vice				
20	presidential candidates and candidates for governor and				
21	lieutenant governor of the same political party in the general				

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election. In such case the horizontal line shall follow the
 name of the candidates for vice president and lieutenant
 governor of the same political party, thereby grouping the
 candidates for president and vice president and governor and
 lieutenant governor of the same political party within the same
 pair of horizontal lines.

7 [-(c)] (d) Immediately to the left of (before) or to the 8 right of (after) the candidate name or names, according to the 9 requirements of the voting system, two vertical lines shall be 10 ruled, so that in conjunction with the horizontal lines, a box 11 shall be formed to the left of or to the right of the name and 12 its equivalent, if any.

[(d)] (e) In case of the candidates for president and vice 13 14 president and governor and lieutenant governor of the same 15 political party, only one box shall be formed opposite their set 16 of names. The boxes shall be of sufficient size to give ample 17 room in which to designate the choice of the voter in the manner prescribed for the voting system in use. All of the names upon 18 19 a ballot shall be placed at a uniform distance from the left 20 edge and close thereto, and shall be of uniform size and print subject to section 11-119." 21



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1 SECTION 2. The chief election officer is directed to 2 establish procedures to implement the purpose of this Act, which 3 shall apply to the first full two year election cycle next 4 following the effective date of this Act. SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed 5 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored. 6 SECTION 4. Report Title: Elections; Ballot; Arrangement of Names

Description:

Requires the Chief Election Officer to select a letter of the alphabet by lot and arrange candidate names on ballots in alphabetical order by last name, beginning with the randomly selected letter. Requires notice to voters that the candidates may not necessarily be listed in alphabetical order on the ballot by a method suited for all voting systems. Directs the Chief Election Officer to establish procedures to implement this new procedure applicable to elections in the next two year election cycle following the effective date.

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
