A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EMERGENCY SERVICES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that when a need arises
- 2 in a county for additional public safety services such as
- 3 lifeguards and emergency medical technicians, the counties are
- 4 typically the first to recognize the need, and then must
- 5 subsequently appeal to the state legislature to respond to the
- 6 identified need. The legislature further finds that shifting
- 7 the responsibility for funding these positions from the State to
- 8 the counties will enable more efficient and responsive action to
- 9 address public safety needs as they arise. As these services
- 10 are essential to the safety of Hawaii's visitors, an increase in
- 11 the total county allocation of the transient accommodations tax
- 12 is an appropriate way for the counties to fund these positions.
- 13 The purpose of this Act is to increase the total county
- 14 allocation under the transient accommodations tax to fund
- 15 lifeguard and emergency medical service personnel positions in
- 16 the counties.

- 1 SECTION 2. Chapter 46, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended 2 by adding a new section to part II to be appropriately 3 designated and to read as follows: 4 "§46-Lifeguard; emergency medical services personnel. 5 (a) Each county shall employ and maintain lifeguards and 6 emergency medical services personnel in sufficient numbers to ensure public safety. 7 8 (b) A county may use revenues provided pursuant to section 9 237D-6.5(b)(4) to fund positions established pursuant to this 10 section." 11 SECTION 3. 15	be known as the emergency medical services special fund to be
16	administered and expended by the department.
17	(b) The moneys in the special fund shall be used by the
18	department for operating a state comprehensive-emergency medical
19	services system including enhanced and expanded services, and
20	shall not be used to supplant funding for emergency medical
21	services authorized prior to [July-1, 2004].

1	(c) Fees remitted pursuant to section 249-31, cigarette
2	tax revenues designated under section 245 15, interest and
3	investment earnings attributable to the moneys in the special
4	fund, legislative appropriations, and grants, donations, and
5	contributions from private or public sources for the purposes of
6	the fund, shall be deposited into the special fund.
7	(d) The department shall submit an annual report to the
8	legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of
9	each regular session that outlines the receipts of, and
10	expenditures from, the special fund."]
11	SECTION 9. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
12	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
13	SECTION 10. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2016.
