

A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE INSTITUTION OF CRIMINAL CHARGES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- another; complicity with respect to the result), section 705-500
- 14 (criminal attempt), section 705-510 (criminal solicitation), or
- 15 section 705-520 (criminal conspiracy), and the underlying
- 16 offense is an offense not listed [above] in subsection (a), (b),
- 17 (c), or (d)."
- 18 SECTION 2. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
- 19 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
- 20 begun before its effective date.

2 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
