Section 708-835.8, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 15 amended by amending subsection (2) to read as follows: 16 "(2) For the purposes of this section, "beer keg" means a 17 metal container used to hold five gallons or more of liquid that 18 is stamped, engraved, stenciled, or otherwise marked with the 19 name of a brewery manufacturer; provided that a deposit beverage 20 container, as defined under section [342G-101,] 342G-1, shall

not be considered a beer keg."

Section 235-18, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 2 repealed. 3 ["[\$235 18] Deposit beverage container deposit exemption. 4 This chapter shall not apply to amounts received as a deposit 5 beverage container deposit collected under part VIII of chapter 6 <del>342G.</del>"] 7 SECTION 7. Chapter 342G, part VIII, Hawaii Revised 8 Statutes, is repealed. 9 SECTION 8. The director of finance shall transfer any **10** unencumbered balance remaining, as of June 30, 2015, in the 11 special fund that is repealed by this Act to the credit of the 12 general fund. 13 This Act shall take effect upon its approval; SECTION 9. 14 provided that the amendments made to section 36-27, Hawaii Revised Statutes, by section 1 of this Act shall not be repealed 15 16 when section 36-27, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is reenacted **17** pursuant to section 34 of Act 79, Session Laws of Hawaii 2009.
