

# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PRESCRIPTION DRUGS.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the Hawaii Rx
- 2 program, legislatively established in 2002 and repealed in 2011,
- 3 was a program in which:
- 4 (1) Participating prescription drug manufacturers paid
  5 rebates to the State at the risk of being treated as
  6 nonparticipating manufacturers;
- 7 (2) Participating residents purchased discounted drugs
   8 from participating pharmacies; and
- 9 (3) The State reimbursed the pharmacies for the discounts of the prescription drugs.
- 11 The legislature believes that a program such as the Hawaii
- 12 Rx program, had it still been in place today, could have acted
- 13 as an effective buffer against any sudden and dramatic price
- 14 increases in the costs of certain drugs, such as Daraprim, whose
- 15 price rose from \$13.50 per pill to \$750 per pill, shortly after
- 16 Turing Pharmaceuticals of New York purchased the rights to the
- 17 drug from Impax Laboratories.



- 1 The purpose of this Act is to reenact the Hawaii Rx
- 2 program.
- 3 SECTION 2. Chapter 346, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 4 amended by adding a new part to be appropriately designated and
- 5 to read as follow:
- 6 "PART . HAWAII Rx PROGRAM
- 7 §346-A Definitions. As used in this part:
- 8 "Administrator" means the director of human services.
- 9 "Department" means the department of human services.
- 10 "Discount" means the amount by which the price of a drug
- 11 sold by a pharmacy is reduced as determined by the department of
- 12 human services.
- "Manufacturer" means anyone who is engaged in
- 14 manufacturing, preparing, propagating, compounding, processing,
- 15 packaging, repackaging, or labeling a prescription drug.
- 16 "Program" means the Hawaii Rx program except as otherwise
- 17 provided.
- 18 §346-B Hawaii Rx program. There is established within the
- 19 department, the Hawaii Rx program. The program will combine the
- 20 purchasing power of all persons to reduce prescription drug
- 21 costs for those in the group. The department may contract with

- 1 a third party or third parties in accordance with chapter 103F
- 2 to administer any single component, or combination of components
- 3 of the program including outreach, eliquibility, claims,
- 4 administration, rebate recovery, and redistribution.
- 5 §346-C Program eligibility. (a) All residents of the
- 6 State shall be eligible to participate in the Hawaii Rx program.
- 7 (b) The department:
- 8 (1) Shall establish procedures for determining eligibility
- 9 and shall issue program enrollment cards to eligible
- 10 residents;
- 11 (2) Shall undertake outreach efforts to build public
- awareness of the program and maximize the enrollment
- of eligible residents; and
- 14 (3) May adjust the requirements and terms of the program
- by rule to accommodate any federally funded
- 16 prescription drug program.
- 17 §346-D Rebate agreement. (a) Any prescription drug
- 18 manufacturer that sells prescription drugs in the State may
- 19 enter into a rebate agreement with the department for the Hawaii
- 20 Rx access program. The rebate agreement shall require the
- 21 manufacturer to make rebate payments to the State each calendar



- 1 quarter or according to a schedule established by the
- 2 department.
- 3 (b) The administrator shall negotiate the amount of the
- 4 rebate required from a manufacturer.
- 5 §346-E Nonparticipating manufacturers. If the department
- 6 and a drug manufacturer fail to reach agreement on the terms of
- 7 a rebate, the department shall conduct a review of whether to
- 8 place that manufacturer's products on the prior authorization
- 9 list or formularies for the state medicaid program in accordance
- 10 with this chapter. The department may release the names of
- 11 manufacturers that do not enter into rebate agreements. This
- 12 information shall be deemed public information. The department
- 13 may also provide to doctors, pharmacists, and other health
- 14 professionals information about the relative cost of drugs
- 15 produced by manufacturers that enter into rebate agreements
- 16 compared to the cost of drugs produced by those that do not
- 17 enter into rebate agreements. The department shall adopt rules
- 18 under chapter 91 creating procedures for the implementation of
- 19 this section.
- 20 §346-F Discounted retail prices for program participants.
- 21 (a) Each pharmacy participating in the Hawaii Rx program shall



- $1\,$  discount the price of drugs covered by the program and sold to
- 2 program participants.
- 3 (b) The department shall establish discounts for drugs
- 4 covered by a rebate agreement and shall promote the use of
- 5 reduced-cost drugs, taking into consideration:
- 6 (1) Reduced prices for state and federally capped drug
- 7 programs;
- 8 (2) Dispensing fees;
- 9 (3) Administrative costs of the department; and
- 10 (4) The average of all rebates provided pursuant to
- 11 section 346-D, weighted by sales of drugs subject to
- those rebates over the most recent twelve-month period
- for which the information is available.
- 14 (c) In making a determination under this section, the
- 15 administrator may rely on pricing information for a selected
- 16 number of prescription drugs where the list of drugs selected
- 17 is:
- 18 (1) Representative of the prescription drug needs of the
- residents of the State; and
- 20 (2) Made public.

1 (d) Beginning July 1, 2018, a participating pharmacy shall 2 offer prescription drugs below the average wholesale price, plus 3 a dispensing fee designated by the department. These initial 4 price levels shall be calculated by the department and the 5 dispensing fee shall not be less than that provided under the 6 state medicaid program. The average wholesale price is the 7 price on a specific commodity that is assigned by the drug 8 manufacturer and is listed in a nationally-recognized drug 9 pricing file. 10 (e) No later than January 1, 2019, a participating 11 pharmacy shall offer prescription drugs at or below the initial price levels specified in subsection (d), minus the amount of 12 13 any discounts as calculated pursuant to subsections (b) and (c) 14 to be paid by the State to the pharmacy. 15 §346-G Pharmacy reimbursement. (a) A pharmacy shall 16 submit claims to the department to verify the amount charged to 17 program participants. On a schedule to be determined by the 18 department, the department shall reimburse each pharmacy for the 19 discounts of prescription drugs provided to program 20 participants.

1	(b)	The department shall collect pharmacy use data
2	necessary	to calculate the amount of the manufacturer rebate
3	under sec	tion 346-D. The department shall protect the
4	confident	iality of information received as required under state
5	or federa	l law, rule, or regulation.
6	§346	-H Hawaii Rx special fund. (a) There is established
7	within th	e state treasury, to be administered by the department,
8	the Hawai	i Rx special fund into which shall be deposited:
9	(1)	All moneys received from manufacturers who pay rebates
10		as provided in section 346-D;
11	(2)	Appropriations made by the legislature to the fund:
12		and
13	(3)	Any other revenues designated for the fund.
14	(b)	Moneys in the Hawaii Rx special fund shall be used for
15	the follo	wing purposes:
16	(1)	Reimbursement payments to pharmacies for discounts
17		provided to program participants;
18	(2)	The cost of administering the Hawaii Rx program,
19		including salary and benefits of employees, and
20		computer costs; and

1 Any other purpose deemed necessary by the department (3) 2 for the purpose of operating and administering the 3 Hawaii Rx program. 4 All interest on special fund balances shall accrue to the 5 special fund. Upon dissolution of the Hawaii Rx special fund, 6 any unencumbered moneys in the fund shall lapse to the general 7 fund. 8 §346-I Annual report. The department shall report the 9 enrollment and financial status of the Hawaii Rx program to the 10 legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of 11 each regular session, beginning with the 2019 regular session." 12 SECTION 3. The administrator of the Hawaii Rx program 13 shall use the administrator's best efforts to obtain an initial 14 rebate amount equal to or greater than the rebate calculated under the medicaid program pursuant to title 42 United States 15 16 Code section 1396r-8. 17 SECTION 4. In implementing this Act, the department of 18 human services shall coordinate with other governmental programs 19 and may take actions to enhance efficiency, reduce the cost of 20 prescription drugs, and maximize the benefits of this and other

governmental programs, including proposals to amend eligibility

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- 1 for the Hawaii Rx program to provide program benefits to the
- 2 beneficiaries of other programs.
- 3 The department of human services may seek waivers of
- 4 federal law, rule, or regulation necessary to implement the
- 5 provisions of this Act.
- 6 SECTION 5. There is appropriated out of the general
- 7 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
- 8 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2016-2017, to
- 9 develop a plan to implement the Hawaii Rx program. The plan
- 10 shall include a description of how the program will operate, how
- 11 the medicaid prescription drug expansion program will be
- 12 integrated into the Hawaii Rx program or describe another
- 13 appropriate design consistent with the goals of the Hawaii Rx
- 14 program, recommend amendments to the enabling legislation,
- 15 estimated funding required for start up and operational costs,
- 16 and any other matters that effect the implementation of the
- 17 program. The department shall report back to the legislature
- 18 regarding the plan no later than twenty days prior to the start
- 19 of the regular session of 2018. The appropriation may be used
- 20 to hire consultants to assist in the preparation of the Hawaii
- 21 Rx program plan.



- 1 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 2 human services for the purposes of this Act.
- 3 SECTION 6. If any provision of this Act, or the
- 4 application thereof to any person or circumstance is held
- 5 invalid, the invalidity does not affect other provisions or
- $oldsymbol{6}$  applications of the Act which can be given effect without the
- 7 invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions
- 8 of this Act are severable.
- 9 SECTION 7. In codifying the new sections added by section
- 10 2 of this Act, the revisor of statutes shall substitute
- 11 appropriate section numbers for the letters used in designating
- 12 the new sections in this Act.
- 13 SECTION 8. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2016.
