BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

Chapter 453, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 2 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated 3 and to read as follows: 4 "§453- Visiting sports team physician; licensure 5 exemption. (a) A physician who is licensed in good standing to 6 practice in another state shall be exempt from the licensure 7 requirements of this chapter while practicing in this State if 8 either of the following apply: 9 (1)The physician has a written or oral agreement with a 10 sports team to provide care to the team members and 11 coaching staff traveling with the team to the State 12 for a specific sporting event to take place in this 13 State; or 14 (2) The physician has been invited by a national sport 15 governing body to provide services to team members and 16 coaching staff at a national sport training center in

this State or to provide services at an event or
