A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO MEDICINE AND SURGERY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Chapter 453, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
3	and to read as follows:
4	"§453- Visiting sports team physician; licensure
5	exemption. (a) A physician who is licensed in good standing to
6	practice in another state shall be exempt from the licensure
7	requirements of this chapter while practicing in this State if
8	either of the following apply:
9	(1) The physician has a written or oral agreement with a
10	sports team to provide care to the team members and
11	coaching staff traveling with the team to the State
12	for a specific sporting event to take place in this
13	State; or
14	(2) The physician has been invited by a national sport
15	governing body to provide services to team members and
16	coaching staff at a national sport training center in
17	this State or to provide services at an event or

1		competition in this State that is sanctioned by the
2		national sport governing body; provided that:
3		(A) The physician's practice is limited to that
4		required by the national sport governing body;
5		and
6		(B) The services provided by the physician shall be
7		within the area of the physician's competence.
8	(b)	A physician who is exempt under subsection (a) from
9	licensure	may not:
10	(1)	Provide care or consultation to any person residing in
11		this State other than persons described in subsection
12		(a) or as otherwise provided by state law; or
13	(2)	Practice at a health care clinic or health care
14		facility in the State, including an acute care
15		facility.
16	<u>(c)</u>	The duration for an exemption under subsection (a)
17	shall be	as follows:
18	(1)	An exemption under subsection (a)(1):
19		(A) Shall be effective while the physician is
20		traveling with the sports team in the State; and

1	(B) Shall not extend beyond ten days per sporting
2	event; provided that:
3	(i) A maximum of twenty additional days per
4	sporting event may be granted by the Hawaii
5	medical board; and
6	(ii) The total period of exemption does not
7	exceed thirty days; and
8	(2) An exemption under subsection (a)(2) shall be
9	effective during the time certified by the national
10	sport governing body; provided that the exemption may
11	not exceed thirty days.
12	(d) The Hawaii medical board may enter into agreements
13	with the medical licensing boards of other states to implement
14	this section. Agreements may include procedures for reporting
15	potential medical license violations."
16	SECTION 2. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
17	matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
18	begun before its effective date.
19	SECTION 3. New statutory material is underscored.
20	SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2070.
