A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO MEDICINE AND SURGERY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Chapter 453, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 2 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
- 3 and to read as follows:
- 4 "§453- Visiting sports physician temporary license.
- 5 (a) The board may issue a visiting sports physician temporary
- 6 license to a physician or osteopathic physician who is not
- 7 licensed in this State. A person holding a visiting sports
- 8 physician temporary license shall be authorized to provide
- 9 medical care to members and coaching staff of a sports team or
- 10 qualifying professional athletic association who are in the
- 11 State for a specific sporting event located in the State. A
- 12 visiting sports physician temporary license issued pursuant to
- 13 this section shall be valid for the period of time requested by
- 14 the applicant, which shall include the period of the sporting
- 15 event; provided that in no case shall a visiting sports
- 16 physician temporary license be valid for more than thirty days.

1	(b)	To receive a visiting sports physician temporary
2	license,	the applicant shall:
3	(1)	Complete and submit an application as prescribed by
4		the board at least thirty days prior to the first day
5		of the period of temporary licensure requested
6		pursuant to subsection (a); provided that the board
7		may waive the thirty day advance application
8		requirement upon request and a showing of good cause;
9	(2)	Provide proof that the applicant is licensed as a
10		physician in another state or country or as an
11		osteopathic physician in another state and that
12		license is current and in good standing;
13	(3)	Provide proof that the applicant has a written
14		agreement with:
15		(A) A sports team that is sanctioned by or is a
16		member of an association or organization of
17		athletic teams that engage in professional,
18		intercollegiate, or interscholastic athletic
19		competitions; or

1		(B) A professional athletic association in which
2		participation in association athletic
3		competitions is limited to association members,
4		for the purpose of providing medical care in the State
5		to members or coaching staff of the sports team or
6		professional athletic association; and
7	(4)	Pay all applicable fees.
8	<u>(c)</u>	A person holding a visiting sports physician temporary
9	license s	hall not:
10	(1)	Provide care or consultation to any person residing in
11		this State other than persons described in subsection
12		(a) or as otherwise provided by state law;
13	(2)	Practice at a health care clinic or health care
14		facility in the State, including an acute care
15		facility; or
16	(3)	Open or appoint a place to meet patients or receive
17		calls from patients relating to the practice of
18		medicine beyond the parameters of subsection (a).
19	<u>(d)</u>	A person holding a visiting sports physician temporary
20	license s	hall obey all laws and rules of this State."

- 1 SECTION 2. (a) The auditor shall conduct a study to
- 2 determine whether licensure for visiting sports physicians is
- 3 warranted. The study shall include:
- 4 (1) A determination of whether licensure is necessary;
- 5 (2) Alternative forms of regulation other than licensure;
- 6 (3) The cost impact on the State requiring licensure of
- 7 visiting sports physicians; and
- 8 (4) Any other issues deemed necessary or relevant by the
- 9 auditor.
- 10 (b) The auditor shall submit a written report of findings
- 11 and recommendations, including any proposed legislation, to the
- 12 legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of
- 13 the regular session of 2017.
- 14 SECTION 3. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
- 15 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
- 16 begun before its effective date.
- 17 SECTION 4. New statutory material is underscored.
- 18 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2112.

Report Title:

Medicine and Surgery; Visiting Sports Physician Temporary License; Study

Description:

Authorizes the Hawaii Medical Board to issue a visiting sports physician temporary license to a physician or osteopathic physician who is not licensed in this State under certain circumstances. Requires the Auditor to conduct a study to determine whether licensure for visiting sports physicians is warranted. (HB1708 HD2)

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
