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A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO ETHICS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Chapter 84, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended
2	by adding a new section to part II to be appropriately
3	designated and to read as follows:
4	" <u>§84-</u> Extracurricular service; exemption. (a) An
5	employee may engage in extracurricular service as provided in
6	this section and not be in violation of this part.
7	(b) To be exempt from this part pursuant to subsection
8	(a), the conduct of the employee shall comply with the
9	following:
10	(1) The employee shall not solicit, accept, or receive,
11	directly or indirectly, any gift for engaging in
12	extracurricular service, as provided in section 84-11;
13	provided that the employee may receive detached
14	remuneration for the performance of extracurricular
15	services;



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1	(2)	The detached remuneration received by the employee
2		shall only be used by the employee in connection with
3		the performance of the extracurricular services; and
4	(3)	The detached remuneration received by the employee
5		shall not be provided by a business or other
6		undertaking in which the employee has a substantial
7		financial interest, or in which the employee is
8		engaged as legal counsel, advisor, consultant,
9		representative, or in any other agency capacity.
10	<u>(c)</u>	As used in this section:
11	"Det	ached remuneration" means a benefit or economic value
12	that is r	eceived by an employee in exchange for the employee's
13	performan	ce of an extracurricular service that is consistent
14	with, sup	plemental to, or complementary to the employee's
15	existing	job duties or description with a state agency,
16	including	but not limited to the receipt of travel.
17	<u>"Ext</u>	racurricular service" means a service performed by an
18	employee	that is not compensated by any state agency, but is
19	known to	and approved by the state agency that employs the
20	employee.	The service performed shall be consistent with,
21	reasonabl	y related to, and in addition to but outside of the



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1	public duties and responsibilities and normal business hours of		
2	the employee. Such service includes but is not limited to		
3	working with private individuals and providers and arranging,		
4	scheduling, organizing, attending, and participating in		
5	meetings, conferences, visitations, travel, trips, or other		
6	gatherings on behalf of or for the benefit of other employees of		
7	the same state agency, or of students or team members of the		
8	employee."		
9	SECTION 2. Section 84-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
10	repealed.		
11	[" §84-1 Construction. This chapter shall be liberally		
12	construed to promote high standards of ethical conduct in state		
13	government."]		
14	SECTION 3. Any existing policy, procedure, or rule		
15	previously adopted by any department or other state agency shall		
16	be reviewed for consistency and compliance with this Act within		
17	ninety days of the effective date of this Act.		
18	SECTION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed		
19	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.		
20	SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
