A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO USE PERMITS FOR SMALL BOAT FACILITIES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Section 200-10, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by amending subsection (f) to read as follows:
3	"(f) Any person [owning] who owns an interest in a
4	corporation or other business entity or is part of a controlled
5	group possessing a valid commercial permit issued by the
6	department, in accordance with rules adopted by the chairperson
7	pursuant to chapter 91, may transfer any or all stock or other
8	interest to another person without terminating the right of the
9	corporation or business entity to retain or renew its commercial
10	permit or any other permit issued to it by the department;
11	provided that:
12	(1) The corporation or business entity has been engaged in
13	the same commercial vessel activity, as defined in
14	section 200-9, for a minimum of one year;
15	(2) The seller shall pay the department a business
16	transfer fee based on the passenger-carrying capacity
17	of the vessels owned or operated by the corporation or

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1		business entity as provided by rules adopted by the	
2		chairperson pursuant to chapter 91, except for	
3		transfers of stock or interest in a corporation or	
4		other business entity between spouses or first-	
5		generation lineal descendants; and	
6	(3)	In the case of a controlled group, the transferee	
7		[must] shall retain eighty per cent control of the	
8		transferor.	
9	Any person possessing a commercial permit shall be required to		
10	meet minimum revenue standards, as a condition of retaining or		
11	renewing the commercial permit.		
12	When	an application for renewal of a commercial permit is	
13	made at l	east sixty days prior to expiration of the commercial	
14	permit, t	he department shall review the application and, within	
15	thirty days of receipt of the application, shall renew the		
16	permit or notify the applicant that the application is		
17	incomplete or cannot be renewed for other reasons and explain		
18	the reaso	ns for the nonrenewal. The applicant shall have thirty	
19	days from the date of notification that the application is		
20	incomplet	e or cannot be renewed to provide additional	
21	informati	on to complete the application or address the reason	

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- 1 stated for the nonrenewal of the permit. Within thirty days of
- 2 receipt of the applicant's amended application, the department
- 3 shall either renew the permit or notify the applicant that the
- 4 permit will not be renewed.
- 5 If the holder of a commercial permit fails to timely obtain
- renewal of a commercial permit, the holder of the permit shall 6
- automatically be granted a thirty-day extension from the date of 7
- the existing permit's expiration to obtain a permit renewal." 8
- 9 SECTION 2. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
- 10 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
- 11 begun before its effective date.
- 12 SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 13 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 14 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.

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Report Title:

Small Boat Facilities; Commercial Use Permit; Renewal; Early Submission; Grace Period

Description:

Authorizes commercial permits holders for small boat harbors to submit permit renewal applications early and be informed of any reasons for a nonrenewal prior to the expiration of the commercial permit. Authorizes a thirty-day grace period for persons who fail to timely file a commercial permit renewal application.

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
