# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HEALTH.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Vector control involves controlling the spread
- 2 of animals that have the potential to carry disease, from
- 3 rodents to insects, including mosquitoes. However, the
- 4 department of health currently has no vector control branch, and
- 5 its vector control unit suffered severe funding cuts several
- 6 years ago.
- 7 According to the department of health, it plans to hire
- 8 more workers for its vector control unit, but still will not
- 9 have nearly as many workers as it once did. A wave of cost-
- 10 cutting measures in 2009 eliminated dozens of workers tasked
- 11 with controlling mosquitoes and rats.
- 12 The legislature finds that the current outbreak of dengue
- 13 fever necessitates an appropriation to the department of health
- 14 to hire more vector control employees and to reestablish a
- 15 vector control branch.

# H.B. NO. H.D.

- 1 The purpose of this Act is to appropriate funds for the
- 2 department of health to hire more full-time employees for vector
- 3 control and to reestablish a vector control branch.
- 4 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general
- 5 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much
- 6 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2016-2017 to the
- 7 department of health to hire thirty-seven full-time equivalent
- 8 (37.0 FTE) positions for vector control, including a vector
- 9 control program manager, communications specialist, and thirty-
- 10 five staff positions, and to take steps to fully reestablish a
- 11 vector control sector branch within the department of health's
- 12 environmental health administration.
- 13 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 14 health for the purposes of this Act.
- 15 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2070.
