A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO MOPEDS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Mopeds are a cheaper alternative to driving a
2	vehicle. According to the city and county of Honolulu, the
3	number of registered mopeds in Honolulu increased every year
4	between 2006 and 2012. Additionally, there were three hundred
5	fifty-four mopeds involved in major traffic accidents on public
6	roadways in 2012.
7	The legislature finds that public safety is a State
8	priority. Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to increase
9	public safety by, among other things:
10	(1) Requiring the director of finance to issue moped
11	number plates;

- 12 (2) Prohibiting the use on public roadways of a moped that
 13 is not in good working order;
- 14 (3) Extending certain police powers dealing with vehicle15 inspections to include mopeds; and
- 16 (4) Requiring annual registration for all mopeds.

1	SECTION 2. Chapter 249, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is

SECTION 6. Section 286-22, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
 amended by amending subsections (a) through (c) to read as

"(a) [The chief of police or any police officer of any
county may, at] <u>At</u> any time when the chief of police or a police
officer has reasonable cause to believe that a vehicle <u>or moped</u>
is unsafe or not equipped as required by law, <u>the chief of</u>
<u>police or any police officer of any county may</u> require the owner
or driver of the vehicle <u>or moped</u> to submit the vehicle <u>or moped</u>
to an inspection or make the necessary corrections or repairs.

11 If the vehicle or moped is found to be in an unsafe (b) 12 condition or if any required part or equipment is not present or 13 if any required part or equipment is present but not in proper 14 repair, the officer shall issue a citation to the owner or 15 driver stating the reasons that the vehicle or moped is deemed 16 unsafe or not equipped as required and shall require that a new 17 certificate of inspection as provided in section 286-26 be 18 obtained within five days or that the defect be cured.

(c) If upon inspection, the chief of police or any police
officer determines that any vehicle <u>or moped</u> is in such unsafe
condition as to constitute a menace to the public <u>or determines</u>

1 that the moped is not equipped as required in this part and 2 cannot reasonably be restored to a safe condition or with 3 respect to mopeds, equipped as required in this part, the chief 4 of police or police officer shall remove the sticker [which] 5 that signifies the certificate of inspection and, with regard to 6 vehicles, inform the director of finance, who shall [forthwith] 7 immediately suspend the registration of the vehicle and give 8 notice of the suspension to its owner. Whenever the director of 9 finance has suspended the registration of any vehicle under this 10 part, the owner of the vehicle shall immediately surrender and 11 forward to the director of finance the certificate of 12 registration and the license plates last issued upon 13 registration of the vehicle for the current year." 14 SECTION 7. In 9 any proceeding for violation of this part[, the]: 10 (1) The registered owner of a vehicle or moped shall be 11 deemed responsible for the unsafe condition of the 12 vehicle [-] or moped; and 13 (2) The registered owner or operator of a moped shall be deemed responsible for the failure to equip the moped 14 15 as required by law." 16 SECTION 9.
