

A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO FIREWORKS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the transportation
2	of fireworks to, from, and within the State of Hawaii requires
3	the use of various modes of transportation, including interstate
4	trucking or rail, interstate maritime transportation, intrastate
5	maritime transportation, and intrastate trucking. The
6	legislature also finds that given the diversity of
7	transportation processes and modes, it is in the best interest
8	of the health and safety of the community and the State's first
9	responders that fireworks shipments imported into the State be
10	thoroughly accounted for and reported. Currently, section 132D-
11	8.6, Hawaii Revised Statutes, sets forth the requirements
12	regarding the shipment of imported fireworks by licensed
13	persons. However, to ensure a more comprehensive tracking of
14	all shipments of fireworks imported into the State, additional
15	requirements of persons or entities defined as the "shipper" are
16	necessary. The requirements for shippers were inadvertently
17	omitted when the definition of "shipper" was added to chapter

1	132D, Hawaii Revised Statutes, by Act 127, Session Laws of	
2	Hawaii 2011.	
3	The purposes of this Act are to:	
4	(1) Set forth the responsibilities of those persons or	
5	entities defined as "shipper" for purposes of	
6	fireworks importation;	
7	(2) Clarify that fireworks may be used in movie	
8	productions and by those authorized to destroy or test	
9	fireworks; and	
10	(3) Clarify the dimensions of labels required for display	
11	fireworks, articles pyrotechnic, and aerial devices.	
12	SECTION 2. Chapter 132D, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is	
13	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated	
14	and to read as follows:	
15	"§132D- Requirements of shipper. Any shipper that	
16	receives fireworks that are imported into the State or	
17	transported between the counties shall notify the county fire	
18	chief of the county to which the shipment is headed, prior to	
19	shipment, whether the shipment will be distributed from:	

(2) Pier to warehouse or storage facility; or

(1) Pier to pier;

1	(3)	Pier to redistribution."
2	SECT	ION 3. Section 132D-6, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
3	amended to	o read as follows:
4	"[+]:	§132D-6[+] Exceptions. The prohibitions in section
5	132D-5 do	not apply to:
6	(1)	The use of flares, noisemakers, or signals for
7		warning, pest control, or illumination purposes by
8		police and fire departments, utility companies,
9		transportation agencies, and other governmental or
10		private agencies or persons, including agricultural
11		operations, in connection with emergencies, their
12		duties, or business; [and]
13	(2)	The sale or use of blank cartridges for a show or
14		theater, or for signal, commercial, or institutional
15		purposes in athletics or sports[-];
16	(3)	The purchase and use of consumer fireworks, aerial
17		devices, display fireworks, or articles pyrotechnic in
18		a film or movie production with a valid permit issued
19		by a county or its authorized designee under section
20		132D-10; and

1	(4)	The testing, disposal, or destruction of illegal or		
2		unwanted fireworks by the licensee."		
3	SECT	ION 4. Section 132D-16.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
4	amended by	y amending subsection (b) to read as follows:		
5	"(b)	Each shell, mine, comet, and multiple tube device,		
6	such as f	inale or barrage boxes, roman candle batteries, or		
7	cakes, sh	all bear a permanent label listing the licensee's name,		
8	address,	and contact information to include telephone number or		
9	electroni	c mail address. The label shall also list the name and		
10	business address of the manufacturer. The label shall be			
11	approved :	by the state fire council and conform to the following		
12	standards	:		
13	(1)	Numerals and letters of the printed matter shall be		
14		not less than one-eighth of an inch high;		
15	(2)	Required statements shall be printed in a color that		
16		contrasts sharply with the background and shall be		
17		printed within a borderline; and		
18	(3)	The label shall measure at least [nine inches by] nine		
19		square inches; provided that if the size of the shell,		
20		mine, comet, or multiple tube device is too small to		
21		correctly display a label of this size, the label may		

1	be reduced to a size no smaller than necessary to
2	properly display the information described in this
3	section."
4	SECTION 5. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
5	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
6	SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
