

A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO FIREWORKS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

The legislature finds that the use of consumer 1 fireworks causes fires and burn injuries, most frequently to 2 children. Fireworks produce excessive smoke, contributing to 3 breathing difficulties. Loud fireworks noises traumatize both 4 war veterans and pets. With the increase in fireworks-related 5 6 calls, public safety agencies are strained to maintain adequate response levels for other critical emergencies. The people of 7 our State deserve to live in peace and security, without the 8 public safety risk and disruptive impact of consumer fireworks. 9 The purpose of this Act is to limit the use of consumer 10 fireworks for cultural purposes only. Display fireworks, 11 articles pyrotechnic, and aerial devices conducted by licensed 12 professionals will still be allowed. However, the use of 13 consumer fireworks will be prohibited on the three designated 14 holidays, namely New Year's Eve, the Fourth of July, and Chinese 15 16 New Year's Day.

1	SECTION 2. Section 132D-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by amending the definitions of "consumer fireworks" and
3	"cultural" to read as follows:
4	""Consumer fireworks" [means]:
5	(1) Means any fireworks designed primarily for retail sale
6	to the public [during authorized dates and times,]
7	that produces visible or audible effects by
8	combustion, and that is designed to remain on or near
9	the ground and, while stationary or spinning rapidly
10	on or near the ground, emits smoke, a shower of
11	colored sparks, whistling effects, flitter sparks, or
12	balls of colored sparks, and includes combination
13	items that contain one or more of these effects.
14	"Consumer fireworks" shall comply with the
15	construction, chemical composition, and labeling
16	regulations of the United States Consumer Product
17	Safety Commission as set forth in Title 16 Code of
18	Federal Regulations and fireworks classified as UN033
19	and UN0337 by the United States Department of
20	Transportation as set forth in Title 49 Code of

1		Federal Regulations [. "Consumer fireworks" include] :

3	(2)	Includes firework items commonly known as firecrackers
4		that are single paper cylinders not exceeding one and
5		one-half inches in length excluding the fuse and one-
6		quarter of an inch in diameter and contain a charge of
7		not more than fifty milligrams of pyrotechnic
8		composition, snakes, sparklers, fountains, and
9		cylindrical or cone fountains that emit effects up to
10		a height not greater than twelve feet above the
11		ground, illuminating torches, bamboo cannons,
12		whistles, toy smoke devices, wheels, and ground
13		spinners that when ignited remain within a circle with
14		a radius of twelve feet as measured from the point
15		where the item was placed and ignited, novelty or
16		trick items, combination items, and other fireworks of
17		like construction that are designed to produce the
18		same or similar effects.
19	"Cul	tural" means relating to the arts, customs, traditions,
20	mores, an	d history of all of the various ethnic groups of
21	Hawaii[-]	and includes religious events."

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SECTION 3. Section 132D-3, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
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    amended to read as follows:
         "§132D-3 [Permissible uses] Use of consumer fireworks[-];
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    prohibition; exception for cultural events. [Gonsumer fireworks
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    may be] It shall be unlawful for any person to set off,

    [ignited, discharged,] ignite, discharge, or otherwise [caused]
    cause to explode any consumer fireworks within the State [only:

         (1) From 9:00 p.m. on New Year's Eve to 1:00 a.m. on New
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              Year's Day; from 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. on Chinese New
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              Year's Day; and from 1:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m. on the
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              Fourth-of-July; or
         (2) From 9:00-a.m. to 9:00 p.m. as allowed by permit
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              pursuant to-section 132D 10 if the proposed cultural
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              use is to occur-at any time other than during the
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              periods prescribed in paragraph (1);],
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    provided that the purchase of not more than five thousand
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    individual consumer fireworks commonly known as firecrackers
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    shall be allowed under each permit."

    amended to read as follows:

13	pursuant to section 132D-10, it shall be unlawful to purchase or
14	possess consumer fireworks [more than five calendar days before
15	the time-periods for permissible-use under section 132D 3.
16	within the State.
17	(c) [It] Except for use at cultural events by permit
18	pursuant to section 132D-10, it shall be unlawful to offer,
19	expose for sale, sell, or furnish consumer fireworks [after
20	12:01-a.m. on New Year's Day, 6:00 p.m. on Chinese New Year's

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Day, and 8:00 p.m. on the Fourth of July.] to any person within
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    the State."
         SECTION 5. Section 132D-8, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
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    amended by amending subsection (d) to read as follows:
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        "(d) It shall be unlawful for any licensee, other than a
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    wholesaler who is selling or transferring fireworks or articles
    pyrotechnic to a licensed retailer, to sell or offer to sell,
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    exchange for consideration, give, transfer, or donate any
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    fireworks or articles pyrotechnic at any time to any person who
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    does not present a permit duly issued as required by section
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    132D-10 or 132D-16. The permit shall be signed by the seller or
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    transferor at the time of sale or transfer of the fireworks or
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    articles pyrotechnic, and the seller or transferor shall
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    indicate on the permit the amount and type of fireworks or
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    articles pyrotechnic sold or transferred. No person shall sell
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    or deliver fireworks to any permittee in any amount in excess of
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    the amount specified in the permit, less the amount shown on the
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    permit to have been previously purchased; provided that no
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    fireworks shall be sold to a permittee holding a permit issued
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    for purposes of section 132D-3, more than five calendar days

3	SECT	ION 6. Section 132D-10, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
4	amended to	o read as follows:
5	"§13	2D-10 Permits[-] for purchase or use of fireworks;
6	fees. A	permit shall be required for the purchase and use of:
7	(1)	Any consumer fireworks [commonly known as firecrackers
8		upon payment of a fee of] for cultural events, the fee
9		for which shall be \$25[+] per permit; and
10	(2)	Any aerial devices, display fireworks, or articles
11		pyrotechnic for the purposes of section 132D-16 [upon
12		payment of a fee of], the fee for which shall be
13		\$110[; and] per permit.
14	[(3)	Any consumer fireworks for the purposes of section
15		132D 5 or for cultural uses that occur at any time
16		other than during the periods prescribed in section
17		132D-3(1) upon-a payment of a fee of \$25.]"
18	SECT	ION 7. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
19	matured,	penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
20	begun bef	ore its effective date.
