

A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HEALTH.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Chapter 321, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 2 amended by adding a new part to be appropriately designated and 3 to read as follows: 4 "PART DEMENTIA 5 §321-Definitions. For the purposes of this part: 6 "Caregiver" means any person who has undertaken the care, 7 custody, or physical control of, or who has a legal or 8 contractual duty to care for the health, safety, or welfare of 9 another individual. "Caregiver" includes but is not limited to 10 owners, operators, employees, or staff of: 11 (1) Hospitals; 12 (2) Hospices; 13 (3) Adult residential care homes; 14 (4)Developmentally disabled domiciliary homes; 15 (5) Developmentally disabled adult foster homes; 16 (6) Intermediate care facilities; 17 (7) Skilled nursing facilities;

                  Duties of department. The department shall study
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    and appraise the State's health needs and resources relating to
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    dementia and shall foster the development and expansion of
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    dementia training for caregivers. The department may:

              Conduct research, investigations, experiments,
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              demonstrations, and studies relating to the incidence,
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              causes, diagnosis, treatment, and prevention of
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              dementia; and
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1 .	(2) Supervise, provide, and direct dementia health
2	services in the State.
3	§321- Training; review. (a) The department shall
4	require training on dementia for all caregivers. Training shall
5	include orientation, basic training, specialty training as
6	appropriate, and continuing education. The department shall
7	require all facility employees and volunteers who routinely
8	interact with individuals with dementia to complete the
9	training.
10	(b) The department shall establish the criteria for all
11	levels of dementia training by June 1, 2018, and review the
12	efficacy of dementia training on an annual basis. The
13	department shall utilize recommendations from the state plan on
14	Alzheimer's disease and related dementias to establish criteria,

implementation of activities, and evaluation of activities."

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SECTION 2.

This Act shall take effect on June 1, 2017.
