BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the display permit

 tellow fee, which authorizes licensed pyrotechnicians to conduct

- upon payment of a fee of \$25;
