A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE HOSPITAL SUSTAINABILITY PROGRAM.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that hospitals in the
- 2 State face major financial challenges in providing quality
- 3 health care for Hawaii residents. These challenges are largely
- 4 the result of inadequate payments from the medicaid program that
- 5 do not cover the actual costs of care. Medicaid is jointly
- 6 financed by the federal and state government but, by statutory
- 7 formula, the federal government only pays between fifty per cent
- 8 and seventy-four per cent of medicaid costs incurred by states
- 9 for care delivered to their medicaid beneficiaries. Federal
- 10 assistance percentages vary by state, with states that have
- 11 lower per capita incomes receiving higher federal matching
- 12 rates. Under federal rules, the state share must be public
- 13 funds that are not federal funds. The legislature finds that
- 14 federal funding to help sustain Hawaii's hospitals financially
- 15 may be accessed through a provider fee.
- 16 The legislature further finds that provider fees exist in
- 17 forty-six states and the District of Columbia as a means of



- 1 drawing down federal funds to sustain their medicaid programs
- 2 due to rising state budget deficits, increasing health care
- 3 costs, and expanding medicaid enrollment. Provider fees, which
- 4 are collected from specific categories of health care providers
- 5 that agree to the fee, may be imposed on nineteen different
- 6 classes of health care services, including inpatient and
- 7 outpatient hospital and nursing facility services.
- 8 The legislature additionally finds that, in Hawaii, a
- 9 provider fee on hospitals has resulted in an increase of
- 10 medicaid payments at a time when there are constraints on the
- 11 State's budget. The additional federal funds obtained via the
- 12 fee program authorized by the hospital sustainability program
- 13 has helped to reduce the amount of losses incurred by hospitals
- 14 and slow the erosion of access to care for medicaid recipients.
- 15 The purpose of this Act is to preserve access to health
- 16 care for medicaid recipients by extending the hospital
- 17 sustainability fee program.
- 18 SECTION 2. Act 217, Session Laws of Hawaii 2012, section

- 3 1. By amending the definitions of "net patient service"
- 4 revenue" and "private hospital" in section -3, Hawaii Revised
- 5 Statutes, to read:
- 6 ""Net patient service revenue" means gross revenue from
- 7 inpatient and outpatient care provided to hospital patients
- 8 converted to net patient revenue utilizing data from Worksheets
- 9 G-2 and G-3 of each hospital's medicare cost report for fiscal
- 10 year [2012 2013.] 2013-2014. If the hospital is new or did not
- 11 file a fiscal year medicare cost report, the department shall
- 12 obtain the hospital's net patient service revenue from the most
- 13 recent period available.
- 14 "Private hospital" means those non-public hospitals named
- 15 in attachment A of the medicaid section 1115 demonstration
- 16 waiver that were in operation in calendar year [2014] 2015 and
- 17 are currently operating [-] or any hospitals not named in
- 18 attachment A of the medicaid section 1115 demonstration waiver
- 19 that became private hospitals in calendar year 2016 and are
- 20 currently operating."

1	2. By amending subsection (c) of section -4, Hawaii
2	Revised Statutes, to read:
3	"(c) Moneys in the hospital sustainability program special
4	fund shall be used exclusively as follows:
5	(1) [To make direct supplemental uncompensated care and
6	upper payment limit payments to private hospitals
7	pursuant to the terms of the section 1115 waiver. At
8	least eighty eight per cent of the moneys in the
9	special fund shall be used for this purpose, provided
10	that in no instance shall a hospital receive
11	supplemental payments that exceed its allowable
12	uncompensated care costs; No less than eighty-eight
13	per cent of the revenue from the hospital
14	sustainability fee shall be used to:
15	(A) Match federal medicaid funds, with the combined
16	total to be used to enhance capitated rates to
17	medicaid managed care health plans for the sole
18	purpose of increasing medicaid payments to
19	<pre>private hospitals;</pre>
20	(B) Match federal medicaid funds for Hawaii's
21	medicaid disproportionate share hospital

1		allotment as authorized by current federal law
2		for private hospitals;
3		(C) Match federal medicaid funds for a private
4		uncompensated care hospital pool for uninsured
5		individuals;
6		(D) Match federal medicaid funds with the combined
7		total to be used to enhance capitated rates to
8		medicaid managed care health plans for the
9		purpose of increasing medicaid payments to
10		private hospitals through a quality incentive
11		pool;
12	(2)	Twelve per cent of the moneys in the hospital ,
13		sustainability program special fund may be used by the
14		department for other departmental purposes; and
15	(3)	Any money remaining in the special fund six months
16		after the repeal of this chapter, shall be distributed
17		to hospitals within thirty days in the same
18		proportions as received from the hospitals."
19	3.	By amending subsections (c) and (d) of section -5,
20	Hawaii Re	vised Statutes, to read:

1 "(c) The hospital sustainability fee for inpatient care 2 services may differ from the fee for outpatient care services 3 but the fees shall not in the aggregate exceed three per cent of 4 net patient service revenue as derived from the hospital's 5 medicare cost report ending during state fiscal year [2012-2013.] 2013-2014. The inpatient hospital sustainability fee 6 7 shall [be 1.892] not exceed three per cent of net inpatient 8 hospital service revenue. The outpatient hospital 9 sustainability fee shall be three per cent of net outpatient 10 hospital service revenue. Each fee shall be the same percentage 11 for all affected hospitals, subject to subsection (d). 12 The department shall exempt children's hospitals, federal hospitals, public hospitals, [rehabilitation hospitals,] **13** 14 and psychiatric hospitals, and any hospital that was not in 15 private operation during any part of calendar year [2014] 2015 **16** from the hospital sustainability fees on inpatient services. **17** addition, the department shall exempt [hospitals with net 18 outpatient revenue of less than \$50,000,000 per year (based on 19 fiscal year 2012 2013 reports) and public hospitals [7] and any 20 hospital that was not in private operation during any part of

- 1 calendar year [2014] 2015 from the hospital sustainability fee
- 2 on outpatient care services."
- 3 SECTION 3. Act 217, Session Laws of Hawaii 2012, section
- 4 2, as amended by section 1 of Act 141, Session Laws of Hawaii
- 5 2013, is amended by amending section -6, Hawaii Revised
- 6 Statutes, to read as follows:
- 7 "S -6 Hospital sustainability fee assessments. (a)
- 8 Hospitals shall pay the hospital sustainability fee to the
- 9 department in accordance with this chapter. The fee shall be
- 10 divided and paid in [four] twelve equal installments on a
- 11 [quarterly] monthly basis.
- 12 (b) The department shall collect, and each hospital shall
- 13 pay, the hospital sustainability fee not later than the
- 14 [fifteenth] thirtieth day after the end of each calendar
- 15 [quarter,] month; provided that if required federal approvals
- 16 have not been secured by the end of a calendar [quarter] month
- 17 the fees for that [quarter] month shall be paid within ten days
- 18 after notification to the hospitals that the required approvals
- 19 have been received."

1 2013, as amended by section 1 of Act 123, Session Laws of Hawaii 2 2014, as amended by section 1 of Act 70, Session Laws of Hawaii 3 2015, is amended by amending section -10, Hawaii Revised Statutes, to read as follows: 4 5 -10 Private hospital payments [-] through enhanced 6 rates to medicaid managed care health plans. [(a) The 7 department shall use moneys solely from the hospital 8 sustainability program special fund to make direct payments to private hospitals, pursuant to the terms of the section 1115 9 10 waiver, in an amount equal to \$88,000,000 to cover the 11 uncompensated care costs incurred by private hospitals for 12 serving medicaid and uninsured individuals during state fiscal 13 year 2015 2016. 14 (b) The department shall use moneys solely from the 15 hospital sustainability program special fund to make direct 16 upper payment limit payments in an amount equal to \$3,975,442, **17** pursuant to the terms of the section 1115 waiver, to level II 18 trauma centers verified by the American College of Surgeons and 19 designated by the department of health, including recognized 20 specialty children's hospitals that do not pay both the 21 inpatient and outpatient assessments.

1	(c) The department shall make quarterly payments to
2	private hospitals to reimburse their uncompensated care costs
3	within twenty days after the end of each calendar quarter;
4	provided that payments shall not be due until at least fifteen
5	days after receipt of the fees required by section -6. If the
6	department fails to pay the full amount when due, there shall be
7	added to the payment a penalty equal to prime plus two per cent
8	of the payment that was not paid when due.
9	(d) Each eligible hospital's quarterly payment shall be
10	equal to one quarter of its prorated share of uncompensated care
11	costs for the fiscal year in which payment is made, as derived
12	from the uncompensated care costs reported by all private
13	hospitals for fiscal year 2012-2013; provided that:
14	(1) Outpatient uncompensated care costs shall be
15	reimbursed at one hundred per cent of reported
16	uncompensated care costs; and
17	(2) Inpatient uncompensated care costs shall be reimbursed
18	on a prorated share based on the remaining
19	uncompensated care-amounts available through the
20	section 1115 waiver.

1	(e) Each cligible hospital's quarterly payment from the
2	hospital sustainability program special fund shall be equal to
3	one-quarter of its share of upper payment limit payments for the
4	fiscal year in which payment is made. Eligible-hospitals shall
5	receive their payments based on their medicaid utilization to
6	ensure access to care for that beneficiary population. [a]
7	The department shall use moneys solely from the hospital
8	sustainability program special fund to fulfill the requirements
9	of section -4(c).
10	(b) In accordance with title 42 Code of Federal
11	Regulations section 438, the department shall use revenues from
12	the hospital sustainability fee and federal matching funds to
13	enhance the capitated rates paid to medicaid managed care health
14	plans for the state fiscal year 2016-2017, consistent with the
15	following objectives:
16	(1) The rate enhancement shall be used exclusively for
17	increasing reimbursements to private hospitals to
18	support the availability of services and to ensure
19	access to care to the medicaid managed care health
20	plan enrollees;

1	(2)	The rate enhancement shall be made part of the monthly
2		capitated rates by the department to medicaid managed
3		care health plans, which shall provide documentation
4		to the department and the hospital trade association
5		located in Hawaii certifying that the revenues
6		received under paragraph (1) are used in accordance
7		with this section;
8	<u>(3)</u>	The rate enhancement shall be actuarially sound and
9		approved by the federal government for federal fund
10		participation;
11	(4)	The rate enhancements shall be retroactive to the
12		effective date of this Act, or the effective date
13		approved by the federal government, whichever is
14		later. Retroactive rate enhancements shall be paid
15		within thirty days of notification by the Centers for
16		Medicare and Medicaid Services to the department of
17	•	all necessary approvals; and
18	<u>(5)</u>	Payments made by the medicaid managed care health
19		plans shall be made within business days upon
20		receipt of monthly capitation rates from the
21		department.

- 1 $\left[\frac{(f)}{(f)}\right]$ (c) If federal approval pursuant to section -7 is
- 2 not received until after the end of any [quarter] month for
- 3 which the hospital sustainability fee is applicable, the
- 4 department shall make the initial [quarterly] monthly payments
- 5 within five days after receipt of the hospital sustainability
- 6 fee for the respective [quarter.] month.
- 7 $\left[\frac{g}{g}\right]$ (d) To the extent the hospital sustainability
- 8 program is not effective for the entire year, the hospital
- 9 sustainability fee, the state medicaid expenses and
- 10 administrative fee, and the corresponding [uncompensated care]
- 11 medicaid managed care health plan payments shall be based on the
- 12 proportion of the fiscal year the program is in effect."

- 7 human services for the purposes of this Act.

- 10 SECTION 9. This Act shall take effect on June 29, 2016;
- 11 provided that section 7 of this Act shall take effect on July 1,
