H.B. NO. 1946

A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO IMMUNIZATION PRACTICES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the Advisory 2 Committee on Immunization Practices is a group of medical and 3 public health experts that develop recommendations on the use of vaccines in the civilian population of the United States. 4 These 5 recommendations are reviewed by the Centers for Disease Control 6 Director and, if adopted, are published as official United 7 States Department of Health and Human Services recommendations 8 to assist states in the prevention and control of communicable 9 diseases.

10 Given the potential for communicable diseases to spread 11 rapidly, it is incumbent upon states to adopt the Department of 12 Health and Human Services' recommendations as quickly as 13 possible. The legislature therefore finds that the rapid 14 adoption, amendment, or repeal of rules regarding the Department 15 of Health and Human Services' immunization recommendations 16 outweighs the public notice, hearing, and comment requirements



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of the State's rulemaking procedures under chapter 91, Hawaii
 Revised Statutes.

The purpose of this Act is to exempt the department of 3 health from the rulemaking process when adopting recommendations 4 5 from the United States Department of Health and Human Services Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices and require the 6 7 department to adopt the recommendations within ninety days. SECTION 2. Section 325-32, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 8 amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows: 9 10 The department may adopt, amend, or repeal rules "(b) [pursuant to chapter 91] to establish a list of specific 11 12 vaccines that are available or may become available. Notwithstanding the notice, public hearing, and comment 13 requirements of chapter 91 and the provisions of chapter 201M, 14 the director of health, in consultation with the state 15 epidemiologist, [may] shall adopt, amend, or repeal as rules, 16 the immunization recommendations of the United States Department 17 of Health and Human Services, Advisory Committee on Immunization 18 Practices, including interim recommendations, within ninety days 19 as they apply to the list of specific vaccines, if any, 20 described in this subsection. The department shall make the 21



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adoption, amendment, or repeal of rules regarding United States
 Department of Health and Human Services, Advisory Committee on
 Immunization Practices immunization recommendations known to the
 public by:

5 (1) Giving public notice of the substance of the proposed
6 rules at least once statewide; and

7 (2) Posting the full text of the proposed rulemaking
action on the Internet as provided in section 91-2.6.
9 The rules, when adopted or amended [pursuant-to-chapter 91] as
10 modified by this section, shall have the force and effect of
11 law. The department may defer the effective date of adopted,
12 amended, or repealed rules to allow sufficient time to ensure
13 compliance with the new, amended, or repealed rules."

SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketedand stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

16 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2016.
