A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO MEDICAL MARIJUANA.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. In 2015, a medical marijuana dispensary system 2 was established in Hawaii. The legislature finds that medical 3 marijuana has a place in the treatment of illness and qualifying 4 patients need ready access to medical marijuana; however, such a 5 dispensary system also carries the potential for risks that 6 cannot be ignored. For instance, there exists a large amount of data concerning the adverse effects of marijuana use, including 7 8 on crime, traffic accidents, unemployment, and mental health. 9 The legislature notes that there have been reports from 10 across the nation regarding individuals who have harmed 11 themselves or others because of the improper or excessive use of 12 marijuana. For example, in Kentucky, a lawyer was struck and 13 killed by the driver of a pickup truck who had consumed alcohol 14 and smoked marijuana not long before the incident. In Colorado, 15 a high-school student died as a result of twenty self-inflicted 16 stab wounds after smoking a large amount of marijuana. A **17** Wyoming college student visiting Denver jumped to his death from

- 1 a hotel balcony after eating six times the recommended amount of
- 2 a marijuana-infused cookie. A woman in Denver was shot and
- 3 killed by her husband in front of their three children after her
- 4 husband had consumed marijuana edibles and began behaving
- 5 erratically. A seventeen-year-old high-school student in
- 6 Boulder, Colorado, committed suicide after consuming a large
- 7 amount of marijuana at a party and then suffering a major
- 8 psychotic breakdown. A college student who accompanied his
- 9 family on a skiing vacation to a Colorado resort purchased
- 10 marijuana edibles in the form of candy and consumed five times
- 11 the recommended amount. Becoming agitated and incoherent, he
- 12 later shot himself and died. The potential consequences of the
- 13 improper use of marijuana can be tragic.
- 14 Legal marijuana use must be restricted only to the
- 15 treatment of illness, and the department of health needs to
- 16 ensure that the distribution of marijuana for Hawaii's medical
- 17 marijuana dispensary system occurs solely for medicinal
- 18 purposes. Accordingly, the medical marijuana dispensary system,
- 19 which took effect on July 1, 2015, warrants a cautious approach
- 20 and further review. The purpose of this Act is to require the
- 21 department of health to conduct such reviews.
