A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EDUCATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Chapter 302A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
3	and to read as follows:
4	"§302A- Sex trafficking prevention education. (a) The
5	department shall offer voluntary training for teachers and
6	educational officers on sex trafficking prevention, including:
7	(1) Strategies for preventing the sex trafficking of
8	children; and
9	(2) Identifying victims of sex trafficking.
10	(b) Beginning with the 2016-2017 school year, each middle,
11	intermediate, and high school operated by the department shall
12	provide to students sex trafficking prevention education, the
13	content of which shall include but not be limited to:
14	(1) Methods used to lure children into sex trafficking;
15	(2) Identifying victims of sex trafficking;
16	(3) Effects of sex trafficking on a victim's social,
17	mental, and physical health;

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1	(4)	Strategies to assist in the prevention of the sex
2		trafficking of children; and
3	(5)	Resource information for victims of sex trafficking.
4	<u>(c)</u>	Sex trafficking prevention education shall be:
5	<u>(1)</u>	Age appropriate;
6	(2)	Aligned with the department's standards, state content
7		and performance standards, and general learner
8		outcomes for grades six through twelve;
9	(3)	Evidence-based and medically accurate;
10	(4)	Culturally sensitive;
11	<u>(5)</u>	Adaptable for special education students and students
12		with limited proficiency in the English language; and
13	(6)	Coordinated with other agencies to provide services to
14		students who have been identified as victims of sex
15		trafficking or at risk of victimization for sex
16		trafficking.
17	<u>(d)</u>	At their own discretion, teachers may answer in good
18	faith any	question initiated by a student that is reasonably
19	related t	o and consistent with the content of sex trafficking
20	preventio	n education.

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1	(e) Parents or legal guardians of students in middle,
2	intermediate, or high school may choose not to allow their
3	children to participate in sex trafficking prevention education.
4	(f) Sex trafficking prevention education shall not
5	discriminate on the basis of sex, race, ethnicity, national
6	origin, religion, disability, sexual orientation, or gender
7	identity.
8	(g) The department may contract with any state or county
9	department or agency, any victim services provider, or any other
10	expert in the field of sex trafficking prevention to implement
11	this section.
12	(h) As used in this section:
13	"Age appropriate" means suitable to a particular age or age
14	group based on developing cognitive, emotional, and behavioral
15	capacity typical for that age or age group.
16	"Medically accurate" means verified or supported by
17	research conducted in compliance with accepted scientific
18	methods and recognized as accurate and objective by professional
19	organizations and agencies with expertise in the relevant field,
20	such as the federal Centers for Disease Control and Prevention,
21	the American Public Health Association, the American Academy of

1 Pediatrics, and the American College of Obstetricians and 2 Gynecologists. 3 "Sex trafficking prevention education" means prevention 4 education in any medium regarding any of the acts described in 5 part I of chapter 712. 6 "Victim services provider" means any non-governmental organization that provides social, medical, mental-health, 7 8 legal, case-management, or housing services to victims of sex 9 trafficking." 10 SECTION 2.
