A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO GOVERNMENT OPERATIONS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the state of New 2 York has been successful in the implementation of lean concepts
- 3 in government that are not focused on cutting positions, but
- 4 rather on the goals of creating efficiencies and promoting
- 5 effectiveness of government operations and services. Building
- 6 on this model, the goal of Hawaii's lean government advisory
- 7 board will be to develop human resources by respecting,
- 8 engaging, and developing state employees to be the best at their
- 9 work. In developing the carrying capacity and capability of
- 10 state employees, the legislature can ensure the public that it
- 11 is making good use of the resources to which it has been
- 12 entrusted.
- 13 The purpose of this Act is to establish a lean government
- 14 advisory board to make recommendations for improving government
- 15 efficiency.

H.B. NO. 2007 H.D. 2

- 1 SECTION 2. Chapter 27, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended
- 2 by adding a new part to be appropriately designated and to read
- 3 as follows:
- 4 "PART . LEAN GOVERNMENT ADVISORY BOARD
- 5 §27-A Lean; definition. As used in this part, "lean"
- 6 describes a business-oriented system for organizing and managing
- 7 product development, operations, suppliers, and customer
- 8 relations that creates precise customer value, expressed as
- 9 providing goods and services with higher quality and fewer
- 10 defects and errors, using less human effort, space, capital, and
- 11 time than more traditional systems.
- 12 §27-B Lean government advisory board; established. (a)
- 13 There is established within the department of human resources
- 14 development, for administrative purposes, a lean government
- 15 advisory board, which shall be composed of:
- 16 (1) The director of each principal department enumerated
- in section 26-4; and
- 18 (2) A member appointed by the governor who is familiar
- 19 with lean principles.
- 20 (b) The member appointed by the governor shall serve as
- 21 chairperson of the lean government advisory board.

H.B. NO. H.D. 2

- 1 The members of the lean government advisory board shall serve without compensation, but shall be reimbursed for 2 expenses, including travel expenses, incurred in the performance 3 4 of their duties. 5 (a) §27-C Lean government advisory board; duties. The 6 lean government advisory board shall apply lean principles to: 7 Analyze the current operations and organization of (1) 8 state government; 9 (2) Identify inefficiencies in government operations; and **10** (3) Recommend improvements that will increase government 11 efficiency and improve the delivery of government 12 services.
- 13 (b) The lean government advisory board shall submit a

 14 report of its findings and recommendations, including any

 15 proposed legislation, to the legislature no later than twenty

 16 days prior to the convening of each regular session."

 17 SECTION 3. In codifying the new sections added by section
- 18 2 of this Act, the revisor of statutes shall substitute
 19 appropriate section numbers for the letters used in designating
 20 the new sections in this Act.
- 21 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2030.
