### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO SPECIAL MINIMUM WAGES.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Section 387-9, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is

2 amended to read as follows:

3 "§387-9 Special minimum wages for learners; apprentices;

4 full-time students; paroled wards of Hawaii youth correctional

5 facility; handicapped workers. (a) Notwithstanding [the

6 provisions of section 387-2, the director [may by rule provide]

7 shall adopt rules that provide for the employment:

8 Of learners, of apprentices, of part-time employees (1) 9 who are full-time students attending public or private 10 schools other than colleges, universities, business 11 schools, or technical schools, and of wards paroled 12 from the Hawaii youth correctional facility, under 13 special certificates issued by the director, at such 14 wages lower than the applicable minimum wage and 15 subject to such limitations as to time, number, 16 proportion, and length of service as the director 17 shall prescribe; and
