## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO SPECIAL MINIMUM WAGES.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECT	ION 1. Section 387-9, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is

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(∠)	Of individuals whose earning capacity is impaired by	
	old age or physical or mental deficiency or injury,	
	under special certificates issued by the director, at	
	such wages lower than the applicable minimum wage and	
	for such period as shall be fixed in the certificates.	
(b)	The director may by rule prescribe standards and	
requirements to ensure that this section will not create a		
substantial probability of reducing the full-time employment		
opportunities of persons other than those to whom the special		
minimum wage rate authorized by this section is applicable.		
(c)	The director shall approve first job training programs	
that empl	oy new and first time hires in businesses with twenty-	
five or more employees that provide a program of job training		
and education that will provide participants with a robust and		
well-rounded experience aimed at developing the following: a		
strong work ethic, positive attitude, good communication skills,		
time management abilities, problem-solving skills, the ability		
to function as a productive team member, self-confidence,		
constructive criticism, flexibility, adaptability, and the
