A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO MARINE SPECIES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that Hawaii's coral reefs 2 are home to a wide variety of marine species, many of which are 3 endemic to Hawaii. The marine species of Hawaii play an 4 important role for the State's inhabitants, providing residents 5 and visitors physical, cultural, environmental, and spiritual sustenance. This need for local marine species can go so far as 7 to remove them from their natural habitats to be used for such purposes as being processed for food or sold as pets. As 8 9 interest in the marine species of Hawaii increases, the number 10 of species being removed from their native coral reefs increases 11 as well. If the take levels increase, the marine species found in the coral reefs of Hawaii will become more vulnerable to 12 13 extinction, which could potentially harm the local environment 14 and people of Hawaii. 15

The purpose of this Act is to convene a task force to identify the ten most vital marine species to Hawaii's reef ecosystems that would be vulnerable to extinction if the take

- 4 SECTION 2. (a) There is established within the department
- 5 of land and natural resources for administrative purposes a
- 6 marine species task force to research and determine the ten most
- 7 vital marine species within Hawaii's reef ecosystems that would
- 8 be vulnerable to extinction if the take level of those species
- 9 increases and to make recommendations on what actions may be
- 10 taken to ensure the sustainability of those species.
- 11 (b) The chairperson of the board of land and natural
- 12 resources shall serve as the chairperson of the task force. The
- 13 task force shall include as participating members:
- 14 (1) The administrator of the division of aquatic
- resources, or the administrator's designee;
- 16 (2) A representative from the office of Hawaiian affairs;
- 17 (3) A representative from the School of Ocean and Earth
- 18 Sciences and Technology of the University of Hawaii;
- 19 (4) A representative from the National Marine Sanctuary
- 20 Foundation;

4	(6)	Any other agency representative or designee deemed
5		appropriate by the chairperson of the board of land

7	(c)	In performing its duties pursuant to this section, the
8	task force	e shall:
9	(1)	Consult with persons and groups who have expertise in
10		marine wildlife found in reef ecosystems;
11	(2)	Examine empirical and scientific data compiled by
12		credible academic and scientific sources; and
13	(3)	Assist in launching initiatives that will provide
14		additional data to be used for the purposes of this
15	•	Act.
16	(d)	Members of the task force shall serve without
17	compensation, and all necessary expenses, including travel	
18	expenses,	shall be paid by the agency, organization, or
19	departmen	t to which the member belongs. No member shall be made
20	subject t	o chapter 84, Hawaii Revised Statutes, solely because
21	of that m	ember's participation as a member of the task force.

- 1 (e) The task force shall submit an initial report on its
- 2 findings to the legislature no later than twenty days prior to
- 3 the convening of the regular session of 2017; and a final report
- 4 and recommendations, including any proposed legislation, no
- 5 later than twenty days prior to the convening of the regular
- 6 session of 2018.

- 7 (f) The task force shall cease to exist on June 30, 2018.
- 8 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2016.
