A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO WATER CONSERVATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECT	ION 1. Chapter 174C, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is	
2	amended b	y adding a new section to be appropriately designated	
3	and to read as follows:		
4	" <u>§</u> 17	4C- Water conservation rebate program. (a) There	
5	is establ	ished a water conservation rebate program. Pursuant to	
6	section 174C-5(13), the commission may coordinate and contract		
7	with publ	ic water systems and utilities to implement the water	
8	conservation rebate program. The total amount of rebates		
9	granted p	ursuant to this section shall not exceed \$2,000,000 in	
10	any calen	dar year.	
11	(b)	The commission shall:	
12	(1)	Prepare any forms that may be necessary to implement	
13		the rebate program, including issuing requests for	
14		proposals from public water systems and utilities	
15		describing their proposed rebate program;	
16	(2)	Require that public water systems and utilities	
17		furnish information documenting the total estimated	

1		amount of water conserved under the rebate program;	
2		and	
3	(3)	Prioritize annual rebates granted pursuant to this	
4		section for public water systems and utilities where	
5		state funds are matched or leveraged with non-state	
6		funds.	
7	(c)	Rebates granted pursuant to this section shall not	
8	support g	reater than fifty per cent of the cost of a newly	
9	constructed water conservation system and shall not exceed		
10	\$1,000 per residential household per year and \$5,000 per		
11	commercial entity for water conservation systems per year.		
12	<u>(d)</u>	As used in this section:	
13	"Pub	lic water system" has the same meaning as in section	
14	340E-1.		
15	"Water conservation systems" means equipment and supplies		
16	used to construct or install a device that materially and		
17	predictably reduces potable water use or waste in a residential		
18	or commercial setting as determined by the commission. The term		
19	may include rain barrels and cisterns, hot water circulation		
20	pumps, low-flow pre-rinse spray nozzles, soil moisture sensors		
21	as a comp	onent of an automatic irrigation system, air	

- 1 conditioning condensate capture, multi-unit water sub-meters,
- 2 high efficiency toilets utilizing 1.28 gallons or less per
- 3 flush, and other devices and apparatus as determined by the
- 4 commission."
- 5 SECTION 2. The commission on water resource management
- 6 shall:
- 7 (1) Review the water conservation system rebate program
- 8 and determine the amount of non-state funds obtained
- 9 as matching funds;
- 10 (2) Determine the impact of the rebate program on water
- 11 conservation in terms of water saved; and
- 12 (3) Make a recommendation to the legislature on whether
- the rebate program should be extended or not.
- 14 The commission on water resource management shall submit a
- 15 report of its findings and recommendations, including any
- 16 proposed legislation, to the legislature no later than twenty
- 17 days prior to the convening of the regular session of 2018.
- 18 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
- 19 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$2,000,000 or so much
- 20 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2016-2017 for the
- 21 water conservation rebate program.
