A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE HAWAII COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. In 2010, the Kalaeloa infrastructure master 2 plan update suggested replacing the seventy-year old electrical 3 system at Kalaeloa in order to serve the projected redevelopment 4 needs of the area. However, the aging electrical system remains 5 in place today. Additionally, since the electrical system does 6 not meet standards established by the Hawaiian Electric Company, 7 area businesses and organizations cannot connect to the public 8 utility and instead must purchase electricity from the Navy. As 9 a result, organizations such as the Hawaii National Guard, 10 stationed at Kalaeloa, must purchase electricity from the Navy 11 at the high rate of \$0.35 per kilowatt hour, amounting to over 12 \$600,000 in annual electricity costs.
- The legislature finds that implementation of the Kalaeloa energy corridor project will upgrade the electrical
- infrastructure, which will support redevelopment of the area and allow area businesses and organizations to purchase electricity
- 17 at lower rates from the Hawaiian Electric Company.

4	(1)	Undertake and complete the Kalaeloa energy corridor	
5		project; and	
6	(2)	Submit annual reports to the 2017 through 2019	
7		legislatures, on the progress and actions taken to	
8		complete the Kalaeloa energy corridor project.	
9	SECT	ION 2. The Hawaii community development authority	
10	shall und	ertake and complete the Kalaeloa energy corridor	
11	project a	t the Kalaeloa community development district as	
12	designate	d by section 206E-192, Hawaii Revised Statutes, and the	
13	surroundi	ng areas. The Kalaeloa energy corridor project shall	
14	meet the	following specifications:	
15	(1)	A utility ductline shall run along lower Fort Barrette	
16		Road and Enterprise Avenue from Kapolei Parkway to	
17		Midway Road;	
18	(2)	A connecting ductline shall run along Saratoga Avenue	
19		from an existing electrical substation to the new	
20		ductline along Enterprise Avenue;	

1	(3)	The utility ductline shall be installed within the
2		road rights-of-way of Fort Barrette Road and
3		Enterprise Avenue;
4	(4)	The utility ductline shall have a total length of
5		approximately eight thousand four hundred feet with a
6		cross-section of up to one and one-half feet by three
7		feet and shall encase polyvinyl chloride conduits to
8		separately hold electrical cables, telephone lines,
9		and cable television lines;
10	(5)	The utility ductline shall be installed predominantly
11		under the road pavement at a depth of approximately
12		five feet;
13	(6)	The top of the utility ductline shall be approximately
14		three feet below the ground surface;
15	(7)	The electrical and communications cables in the
16		utility ductline shall have laterals that connect with
17		existing lines in the adjacent non-Navy properties
18		located along Enterprise Avenue and Midway Road;
19	(8)	Each of the electrical connections shall have
20		associated electrical meters; and

Ĺ	(9)	The specific location of the utility ductline within
2		the rights-of-way shall be coordinated with the United
3		States Navy and utility companies having existing
4		facilities within the rights-of-way.

5 SECTION 3. The Hawaii community development authority 6 shall submit a report to the legislature no later than twenty

7 days prior to the convening of the 2017, 2018, and 2019 regular

 ${f 8}$ sessions on the progress of implementing the Kalaeloa energy

9 corridor project.

10 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon approval.
