A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE HAWAII COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. In 2010, the Kalaeloa infrastructure master 1 2 plan update suggested replacing the seventy-year old electrical system at Kalaeloa in order to serve the projected redevelopment 3 needs of the area. However, the aging electrical system remains 4 in place today. Additionally, since the electrical system does 5 not meet standards established by the Hawaiian Electric Company, 6 area businesses and organizations cannot connect to the public 7 utility and instead must purchase electricity from the Navy. As 8 9 a result, organizations such as the Hawaii National Guard, stationed at Kalaeloa, must purchase electricity from the Navy 10 at the high rate of \$0.35 per kilowatt hour, amounting to over 11 12 \$600,000 in annual electricity costs.

13 The legislature finds that implementation of the Kalaeloa 14 energy corridor project will upgrade the electrical 15 infrastructure, which will support redevelopment of the area and 16 allow area businesses and organizations to purchase electricity 17 at lower rates from the Hawaiian Electric Company.



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1 The purpose of this Act is to improve the electrical 2 infrastructure at Kalaeloa by requiring the Hawaii community 3 development authority to: 4 (1) Undertake and complete the Kalaeloa energy corridor 5 project; and Submit annual reports to the 2017 through 2019 6 (2) 7 legislatures on the progress and actions taken to 8 complete the Kalaeloa energy corridor project. SECTION 2. The Hawaii community development authority 9 shall undertake and complete the Kalaeloa energy corridor 10 11 project at the Kalaeloa community development district as designated by section 206E-192, Hawaii Revised Statutes, and the 12 surrounding areas. The Kalaeloa energy corridor project shall 13 meet the following specifications: 14 A utility ductline shall run along lower Fort Barrette 15 (1) 16 Road and Enterprise Avenue from Kapolei Parkway to 17 Midway Road; (2) A connecting ductline shall run along Saratoga Avenue 18 19 from an existing electrical substation to the new ductline along Enterprise Avenue; 20

| 12 | SECTION 3. The Hawaii community development authority |

| 15 | sessions on the progress of implementing, and action taken to |
| 16 | implement, the Kalaeloa energy corridor project. |
| 17 | SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050. |
