A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO COMMUNITY IMPROVEMENT DISTRICTS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that a lack of affordable
- 2 housing has begun to exacerbate high housing costs and has begun
- 3 to leave Hawaii's residents without a place to call home. It is
- 4 estimated that more than six thousand new units are needed
- 5 annually to keep pace with current demand.
- 6 The legislature also finds that the Kapalama and Iwilei
- 7 areas are ideal for a 21st century community that encourages
- 8 walking, biking, and rail transit in close proximity to the
- 9 urban core. The San Antonio Riverwalk and Denver's 16th Street
- 10 pedestrian mall, featuring mixed-use restaurants, commercial
- 11 spaces, and residences along pedestrian and bike-friendly
- 12 promenades, have proven a popular and successful way to create
- 13 people-friendly communities to house local residents in an urban
- 14 setting. These successes can also apply here.
- With rail transit soon to come through the area, interest
- 16 rates at an advantageous low, and the growing need for
- 17 affordable rental housing, the legislature finds that aligning

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1	state and county goals to create an attractive and affordable		
2	community in a reasonable timespan is a top priority.		
3	The purpose of this Act is to establish community		
4	improvement districts as an innovative means of accelerating		
5	appropriate development in certain areas of the State.		
6	SECTION 2. The Hawaii Revised Statutes is amended by		
7	adding a new chapter to be appropriately designated and to read		
8	as follows:		
9	"CHAPTER		
10	COMMUNITY IMPROVEMENT DISTRICTS		
11	§ -1 Community improvement districts; established.		
12	Community improvement districts shall be established according		
13	to the following:		
14	(1) The legislature, by law, shall establish a community		
15	improvement district;		
16	(2) Upon the designation of a community improvement		
17	district by the legislature, state departments and		
18	agencies shall coordinate with the respective county		
19	to reach the goals and requirements of the community		
20	improvement district;		

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1	(3)	A country in which chert is established a community
2		improvement district shall prioritize the issuing of
3		permits and other actions as necessary to meet the
4		goals and requirements of the community improvement
5		district;
6	(4)	A county in which there is established a community
7		improvement district shall consider forms of
8		innovative financing such as establishing community
9		facilities districts, pursuant to section 46-80.1,
10		within all or part of a community improvement district
l1		to meet the goals and requirements of the community
12		improvement district;
13	(5)	The department of accounting and general services may
14		provide innovative loan financing as appropriate from
15		the community improvement district revolving fund to
16		assist a county or third party in meeting the goals
17		and requirements of a community improvement district;
18		and
19	(6)	The department of accounting and general services, in

consultation with counties in which there are

established any community improvement districts, shall

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1		report to the registature no rater than becember i or
2		the year preceding each legislative session on the
3		following:
4		(A) State and county plans to coordinate with each
5		other in meeting the goals and requirements of
6		the community improvement districts; and
7		(B) Updates on the progress in meeting the goals and
8		requirements of a community improvement district.
9	§ -	-2 Community improvement district revolving fund. (a)
10	There shall	ll be established in the treasury of the State a
11	revolving	fund to be known as the community improvement district
12	revolving	fund, which shall be administered by the department of
13	accounting	g and general services.
14	(b)	The revenues of the revolving fund shall consist of:
15	(1)	Funds received by the department from the counties for
16		the repayment of any loan principal and the payment of
17		simple interest from the various assessments or fees
18		from community facilities districts, special
19		improvement districts, improvement districts, tax
20		increment financing, and other sources;
21	(2)	Appropriations from the legislature or counties;

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1	(3)	Federal grants and subsidies to the State or counties;
2	(4)	Private investor contributions; and
3	(5)	Grants and donations.
4	(c)	The department shall expend revenues in the fund to:
5	(1)	Make loans to counties, state agencies, or private
6		developers for the costs, in whole or in part, of the
7		planning, design, or construction of infrastructure
8		improvements that meet the goals and requirements of a
9		community improvement district; and
10	(2)	Repay private investors for their investment plus any
11		interest accrued on their investments made into the
12		fund.
13	(d)	The department shall adopt rules in accordance with
14	chapter 9	1 for the purposes of this section."
15	SECT	TON 3. (a) There shall be established the Kapalama
16	community	improvement district pilot project, which shall be
17	bounded b	y Waiakamilo Road, North King Street, River Street, and
18	North Nim	itz Highway.
19	(b)	District goals within the Kapalama community
20	improveme	ent district shall be the construction of a minimum of
21	six thous	and new housing units of which at least fifty per cent

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- 1 shall be affordable rental units and at least twenty-five per
- 2 cent shall be affordable fee simple units.
- 3 (c) The transit infrastructure within the Kapalama
- 4 community improvement district shall have a primary focus on
- 5 pedestrian, bicycle, and public transit.
- 6 (d) A pedestrian and bicycle transit corridor shall
- 7 connect Kapalama Canal with Fort Street Mall, providing safe and
- 8 comfortable pedestrian and bicycle transit to the downtown core.
- 9 (e) The department of accounting and general services and
- 10 the city and county of Honolulu shall complete public
- 11 infrastructure improvements within the Kapalama community
- 12 improvement district in order that units may be occupied by not
- 13 later than July 1, 2022.
- 14 (f) Not less than twenty days prior to the convening of
- 15 each regular session, the department of accounting and general
- 16 services, in cooperation with the city and county of Honolulu,
- 17 shall submit a report to the legislature that shall include the
- 18 following:
- 19 (1) The progress toward obtaining private investment
- 20 financing into the community improvement district
- 21 revolving fund;

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1	(2)	Recommendations for other innovative funding
2		opportunities; and
3	(3)	Recommendations for reasonable public capitalization
4		for the community improvement district revolving fund
