# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO TRANSPORTATION.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The legislature finds that Hawaii's high dependence on the personal automobile and imported fossil fuels costs our economy billions of dollars each year, increases household transportation costs for Hawaii's families, decreases access to job opportunities for low income individuals, leads to increased traffic congestion that costs Hawaii's residents both time and money, and degrades our quality of life.

8 The legislature further finds that increasing multi-modal 9 transportation options in Hawaii's communities decreases travel 10 distances, decreases transportation energy use, makes more 11 efficient use of limited public rights of way, and promotes 12 greater active transportation and healthier communities. 13 Establishment of mode share targets and plans to increase the 14 use of various modes of transportation will help increase the 15 availability and utilization of non-automobile modes of 16 transportation, reduce transportation energy use, and reduce

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household transportation costs while increasing mobility and
 transportation equity for Hawaii residents.

The purpose of this Act is to update the statewide transportation plan process pursuant to chapter 279A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, to include the creation of a Hawaii household transportation survey and to direct the counties and department of transportation to create mode share targets and plans to be included in the statewide transportation plan.

9 SECTION 2. Section 279A-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
10 amended to read as follows:

11 "§279A-2 Statewide transportation plan. (a) [<del>The</del>] In 12 accordance with 23 Code of Federal Regulations section 450.214, 13 the state department of transportation shall prepare a new 14 statewide transportation plan and shall submit said plan to the 15 legislature in its 1978 session and thereafter as often as the 16 plan is updated. The legislature shall adopt the plan by 17 resolution. The plan shall be directed toward the ultimate 18 development of a balanced, multi-modal statewide transportation 19 system that serves clearly identified social, economic, and 20 environmental objectives. The statewide transportation plan 21 shall include the following system components:

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1	(1)	The national system of interstate and defense
2		highways, and highways within the state highway
3		system;
4	(2)	Airports;
5	(3)	Harbors and water-borne transit;
6	(4)	Surface mass transit systems; [and]
7	(5)	Major county roads[+]; and
8	(6)	State and county bicycle facilities.
9	The	department of transportation shall pay particular
10	attention	to the interfacing of the various modes of
11	transport	ation.
12	(b)	The statewide transportation plan shall:
13	(1)	Include projected transportation needs for a [ <del>six-</del>
14		year] at least a twenty-year period and a schedule of
15		priorities for the construction, modification, and
16		maintenance of various segments of the statewide plan
17		that involve either state-operated systems or county-
18		operated systems that may require state financial
19		assistance for a twenty-year period; and
20	(2)	Comply with county transportation-related plans;
21		county general plans; and all community, development,

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1	or community development plans adopted pursuant to the
2	county general plan, to the extent that compliance
3	does not affect the receipt of federal funds.
4	(c) [Both the six year and twenty year estimates shall be
5	updated annually.] Pursuant to 23 Code of Federal Regulations
6	section 450.216, the department of transportation shall develop
7	a statewide transportation improvement program which shall cover
8	a period of no less than four years and shall be updated every
9	three years. The statewide transportation improvement program
10	shall be used to schedule and program funding for construction,
11	modification, and maintenance projects identified in the
12	statewide transportation plan, subject to the availability of
13	funding.
14	(d) The department of transportation shall work with the
15	counties and metropolitan planning organizations to create a
16	statewide household transportation survey. The survey shall
17	gather information on travel behavior statewide including
18	transportation methods for both commute and non-commute trips.
19	At a minimum, the survey shall include trip information on the
20	use of the following modes of transportation:



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1	(1)	Car, truck, or van including single occupant and
2		carpool;
3	(2)	Public transportation;
4	(3)	Walking; and
5	(4)	Bicycle.
6	The depar	tment shall work with the counties and metropolitan
7	planning	organizations to conduct the survey every three years,
8	beginning	in 2018.
9	<u>(e)</u>	Each county or metropolitan planning organization
10	<u>shall dev</u>	elop transportation mode share plans that include mode
11	<u>share tar</u>	gets based on the metrics established by the state
12	departmen	t of transportation through data collected in the
13	statewide	household transportation survey. Mode share plans may
14	include s	ub-county targets, such as for urban districts. Mode
15	<u>share tar</u>	gets for both commute and non-commute trips shall
16	include:	
17	(1)	'Fewer than' mode share targets for car, truck, or van
18		and single occupant modes of transportation; and
19	(2)	'Greater than' mode share targets for public
20		transportation, walking, and bicycle modes of
21		transportation.



1	Mode	share targets shall seek to increase non-automobile
2	modes of t	ransportation in order to reduce travel distances,
3	transporta	ation energy use, and household transportation costs
4	and increa	ase mobility and transportation equity for the
5	residents	of each county.
6	Each	county or metropolitan planning organization mode
7	share plan	n shall:
8	(1)	Create mode share targets for the years 2024, 2030,
9		and 2036;
10	(2)	Delineate the transportation infrastructure,
11		transportation and land use policies, and programs and
12		strategies necessary to achieve the county's mode
13		share targets;
14	<u>(3)</u>	Be incorporated into county general, transportation,
15	·	and land-use plans and metropolitan planning
16		organization plans; and
17	(4)	Be completed and submitted to the state department of
18		transportation by December 31, 2019, with updates
19		submitted every six years thereafter extending the
20		planning horizon an additional six years.

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1	(f) Beginning in 2021, each successive update of the
2	statewide transportation plan shall include the county specific
3	mode share targets created pursuant to subsection (e)."
4	SECTION 3. The department of transportation shall partner
5	with one or more counties or metropolitan planning organizations
6	to use \$500,000 of appropriate federal funds, or so much thereof
7	as may be necessary for the planning and implementation of the
8	statewide transportation survey.
9	Each county or metropolitan planning organization shall
10	apply to the department of transportation to use \$250,000 of
11	appropriate federal funds, or so much thereof as may be
12	necessary for the purpose of creating mode share plans and
13	targets pursuant to this Act.
14	SECTION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
15	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
16	SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.

**Report Title:** Statewide Transportation Plan; Modes of Transportation

#### Description:

Amends the statewide transportation plan to include bicycle facilities as part of the transportation system components. Requires the Department of Transportation to develop a survey on travel behavior. Requires each county to develop transportation mode sharing plans and to update these plans every five years beginning in 2025. (HB2086 HD1)
