A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO YOUTH GANGS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that youth violence is a 2 growing concern in Hawaii, particularly violence and juvenile
- 3 delinquency associated with gang membership. In addition,
- 4 homicide, suicide, aggravated assaults, and traffic accidents
- 5 due to alcohol consumption by underage youth represent large
- 6 costs for the State. In 2010, overall youth violence cost the
- 7 State over \$109,000,000, with \$28,000,000 in costs resulting
- ${f 8}$ from youth property crime alone. In 2013, the average cost to
- 9 incarcerate a youth at the Hawaii youth correctional facility
- 10 was over \$199,000 a year. Unfortunately, three-quarters of all
- 11 youth leaving the facility were re-adjudicated as delinquents or
- 12 convicted as adults within three years.
- 13 Consequently, the legislature finds that a multi-pronged
- 14 approach should be taken with programs that have the expertise
- 15 and experience to reach out and establish relationships and help
- 16 promote education, self-esteem, individual growth and
- 17 development, leadership, and responsibility. Furthermore,

- 1 destruction to lives of constructive behavior will help
- 2 immensely to solidify and secure school and community safety.
- 3 Such programs will be able to establish strong relationships and
- 4 partnerships with schools and community leaders to help
- 5 coordinate appropriate services required for the youth at risk.
- 6 The legislature further finds that this multi-pronged approach
- 7 should incorporate an in-school centered group counseling
- 8 program that will help address the deep rooted issues such as
- 9 aggressive behavior and violence to ensure that youths who are
- 10 most at risk are being identified and served in their respective
- 11 communities and schools. Strong target areas to reach out to
- 12 include Kalihi, Waipahu, Wahiawa, Ewa Beach, Kapolei, and
- 13 Waianae.
- 14 The purpose of this Act, therefore, is to help reduce youth
- 15 violence and delinquency in the State by appropriating funds to
- 16 the department of human services to fund the operational costs
- 17 to provide therapeutic prevention and mental health programs for
- 18 high risk youth.
- 19 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general
- 20 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
- 21 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2016-2017 to

- 1 fund operational costs to provide training, program evaluation,
- 2 therapeutic prevention, and mental health programs including in-
- 3 school centered group counseling for high risk youth.
- 4 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 5 human services for the purposes of this Act.
- 6 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2060.
