A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PUBLIC HEALTH.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the Red Hill bulk 2 fuel storage facility is an important symbol of Hawaii's 3 integral role in United States military operations. The 4 facility is under the sole control of the United States Navy and 5 has held fuel for the United States Navy since the 1940s. 6 Recognized as a National Historic Civil Engineering Landmark, 7 the Red Hill fuel storage facility consists of twenty 8 underground fuel storage tanks and is capable of holding more 9 than 250,000,000 gallons of fuel.

10 The legislature further finds that the facility has a 11 history of fuel being released through leaks from the storage 12 tanks. These releases of fuel can affect the nearby groundwater 13 and the health of the population in the area.

14 The legislature further finds that in response to releases 15 from the facility, the United States Navy, the United States 16 Defense Logistics Agency, the United States Environmental 17 Protection Agency, and the department of health began

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negotiating an enforceable agreement. After a period of public 1 2 comment, the final version of this agreement, Administrative Order on Consent, EPA Docket No. RCRA 7003-R9-2015-01, DOH 3 Docket No. 15-UST-EA-01, became effective on September 28, 2015. 4 5 The Administrative Order on Consent establishes a timeframe for 6 the United States Navy and the United States Defense Logistics 7 Agency to evaluate and remediate existing contamination to the 8 extent practicable in the vicinity of the Red Hill bulk fuel 9 storage facility, as well as to evaluate and implement measures 10 to prevent future releases.

The legislature further finds that the primary goal of the 11 12 Administrative Order on Consent is to ensure the long-term protection of groundwater resources in the vicinity of the Red 13 14 Hill bulk fuel storage facility. The initial phases of the 15 Administrative Order on Consent focus on accomplishing the 16 extremely complex and critical work of evaluating, designing, 17 and selecting cleanup specifics and upgrade technologies for the massive, uniquely engineered tanks, which are believed to be the 18 largest underground fuel tanks in the world. The work table for 19 20 the Administrative Order on Consent, however, does not explicitly provide a specific due date by which all leaks to the 21

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1 fuel tanks shall be repaired. Rather, the work table 2 establishes deadlines relative to other unspecified deadlines 3 for approvals and meetings. 4 The legislature further finds that due to the lack of 5 certainty inherent in the Administrative Order on Consent's 6 schedule of work, the State has an urgent public health interest 7 in monitoring the United States Navy and the United States 8 Defense Logistics Agency's compliance with the Administrative 9 Order on Consent. 10 The purpose of this Act is to protect public health by: 11 (1) Appropriating funds to the department of health to: 12 (A) Establish full-time positions (FTE); and 13 (B) Contract with consultants with expertise in 14 hydrology, geology, underground storage tanks, or 15 other areas relevant to the storage of fuel, 16 public health, or environmental health, as 17 necessary, 18 to monitor the United States Navy and the United 19 States Defense Logistics Agency's compliance with the 20 Administrative Order on Consent;

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1	(2)	Requiring the department of health to seek
2		reimbursement from the United States Navy and the
3		United States Defense Logistics Agency for the
4		foregoing appropriated moneys;
5	(3)	Appropriating funds for the siting and installation of
6		two monitor wells to test the condition of the
7		groundwater aquifer under and surrounding the Red Hill
8		bulk fuel storage facility; and
9	(4)	Requiring the department of health to submit annual
10		reports to the legislature regarding the United States
11		Navy and the United States Defense Logistics Agency's
12		compliance with the Administrative Order on Consent.
13	SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general	
14	revenues	of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much
15	thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2016-2017 for the	
16	department of health to hire full-time equivalent	
17	geologist I employees (FTE) to monitor the United States	
18	Navy's and the United States Defense Logistics Agency's	
19	compliance with Administrative Order on Consent, EPA Docket No.	
20	RCRA 7003-R9-2015-01, DOH Docket No. 15-UST-EA-01.	

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The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
 health for the purposes of this Act; provided that the
 department of health shall seek reimbursement from the United
 States Navy and the United States Defense Logistics Agency for
 this expenditure.

6 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general 7 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much 8 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2016-2017 for the 9 department of health to hire full-time equivalent engineer IV employees (FTE) to monitor the United States Navy's and 10 the United States Defense Logistics Agency's compliance with 11 12 Administrative Order on Consent, EPA Docket No. RCRA 7003-R9-13 2015-01, DOH Docket No. 15-UST-EA-01.

14 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of 15 health for the purposes of this Act; provided that the 16 department of health shall seek reimbursement from the United 17 States Navy and the United States Defense Logistics Agency for 18 this expenditure.

19 SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the general
20 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much
21 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2016-2017 for the

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department of health to hire full-time equivalent
 environmental health specialist IV employees (FTE) to
 monitor the United States Navy's and the United States Defense
 Logistics Agency's compliance with Administrative Order on
 Consent, EPA Docket No. RCRA 7003-R9-2015-01, DOH Docket No. 15 UST-EA-01.

7 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of 8 health for the purposes of this Act; provided that the 9 department of health shall seek reimbursement from the United 10 States Navy and the United States Defense Logistics Agency for 11 this expenditure.

SECTION 5. There is appropriated out of the general 12 13 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much 14 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2016-2017 for the department of health to contract with consultants with expertise 15 in hydrology, geology, underground storage tanks, or other areas 16 17 relevant to the storage of fuel, public health, or environmental 18 health to monitor the United States Navy's and the United States 19 Defense Logistics Agency's compliance with Administrative Order on Consent, EPA Docket No. RCRA 7003-R9-2015-01, DOH Docket No. 20 21 15-UST-EA-01.

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The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
 health for the purposes of this Act; provided that the
 department of health shall seek reimbursement from the United
 States Navy and the United States Defense Logistics Agency for
 this expenditure.

6 SECTION 6. There is appropriated out of the general 7 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much 8 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2016-2017 for the 9 siting and installation of two monitor wells to test the 10 condition of the groundwater aquifer underneath and surrounding 11 the Red Hill bulk fuel storage facility.

12 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of13 health for the purposes of this Act.

14 SECTION 7. The department of health, at least twenty days 15 before the convening of each regular session, beginning with the regular session of 2017, shall report annually to the 16 17 legislature on the status of the United States Navy's and the 18 United States Defense Logistics Agency's compliance with 19 Administrative Order on Consent, EPA Docket No. RCRA 7003-R9-20 2015-01, DOH Docket No. 15-UST-EA-01, until the United States 21 Navy and the United States Defense Logistics Agency have

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- 1 fulfilled all of their obligations under the Administrative
- 2 Order on Consent.
- 3 SECTION 8. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2016.
