## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO SOCIAL WORKERS.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1.	SECTION 1. The legislature finds that social workers in
2	Hawaii who are working to complete their licensed clinical
3	social worker requirements must complete three thousand hours of
4	supervised work experience, one hundred hours of which must be
5	by direct face-to-face supervision. The legislature further
6	finds that certain social workers, particularly those living on
7	the less populated islands, in rural areas, and those employed
8	by the United States Department of Veterans Affairs, may
9	experience challenges meeting the direct face-to-face
10	supervision requirement. This is especially true for social
11	workers in rural areas, as there are a limited number of rural
12	social workers who are qualified to provide supervision for

13 applicants for licensure as clinical social workers.

The legislature additionally finds that telehealth has become standard practice in social work and the mental health field and should be permitted as a means of meeting the

17 supervision requirements needed for licensure as a clinical

18 social worker.

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1	Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to clarify the
2	supervision requirements for licensure of clinical social
3	workers, including permitting the option to fulfill all or part
4	of the face-to-face supervision requirements through supervision
5	via a video conference service that is compliant with all
6	federal and state privacy, security, and confidentiality laws,
7	including the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability
8	Act of 1996.
9	SECTION 2. Section 467E-7, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
10	amended to read as follows:
11	"§467E-7 Licensing requirements. Every applicant for a
12	license as a social worker shall submit evidence satisfactory to
13	the director that the applicant meets the following
14	requirements:
15	(1) For the licensed bachelor social worker, the
16	applicant:
17	(A) Holds a bachelor's degree from a college or
18	university in a social work program accredited by
19	or deemed to be equivalent to a program
20	accredited by the Council on Social Work
21	Education; and

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1		(B) Has passed the basic level national examination
2		given by the Association of Social Work Boards;
3	(2)	For the licensed social worker, the applicant:
4		(A) Holds a master's degree from a college or
5		university in a social work program accredited by
6		or deemed to be equivalent to an accredited
7		program by the Council on Social Work Education
8		or a doctoral degree from a doctoral degree
9		program in social work accredited by the Western
10		Association of Schools and Colleges or a
11		comparable regional accreditation body; and
12		(B) Has passed the intermediate or higher level
13		national examination given by the Association of
14		Social Work Boards; and
15	(3)	For the licensed clinical social worker, the
16		applicant:
17		(A) Has met the educational requirements in paragraph
18		(2);
19		(B) Has passed the clinical level national
20		examination given by the Association of Social
21		Work Boards; [ <del>and</del> ]

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1	(C)	Has provided evidence of successful completion of
2		at least three thousand hours of post masters
3		clinical social work experience under supervision
4		completed within no fewer than two years, but
5		within no more than five years. Clinical social
6		work experience shall include a minimum of two
7		thousand hours of assessment, clinical diagnosis,
8		and psychotherapy; no more than a maximum of nine
9		hundred hours of client-centered advocacy,
10		consultation, and evaluation; and at least one
11		hundred hours of [direct face-to-face]
12		supervision[-] as follows:
13		(i) At least sixty of the one hundred hours of
14		direct face-to-face supervision shall have
15		been individualized supervision [and the
16		remaining]; and
17		(ii) Not more than forty hours of direct face-to-
18		face supervision may have been under small
19		group (up to six supervisees) supervision[7
20		provided that:

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1		An a	oplicant who submits evidence of
2		cert	ification as a qualified clinical social
3		work	er or diplomate in clinical social work by
4		the l	National Association of Social Workers or as
5		a bo	ard certified diplomate by the American Board
6		of E	xaminers shall be deemed to have satisfied
7		the	experience requirements of this subparagraph;
8	(D)	For	the purposes of subparagraph (C), shall have
9		had	clinical supervision as follows:
10		(i)	The supervisor shall have been a licensed
11			clinical social worker with at least four
12			thousand five hundred hours of post masters
13			clinical social work experience;
14		(ii)	For the first five years after July 1, 2004,
15			the following individuals shall be deemed to
16			have satisfied the requirements of a
17			supervisor: a person with a master's degree
18			in social work with at least four thousand
19			five hundred hours post masters clinical
20			social work experience; an individual who
21			holds a diplomate in clinical social work or

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1	a board certified diplomate certification;
2	or a board certified psychiatrist,
3	psychologist, advanced practice registered
4	nurse who has a minimum of four thousand
5	five hundred hours of post masters clinical
6	experience in assessment, clinical
7	diagnosis, and psychotherapy; and
8	(iii) Supervision shall have [ <del>occurred in an</del>
9	agency setting that provides included
10	review of assessment, clinical diagnosis,
11	and psychotherapy[-
12	An applicant who submits evidence of
13	certification as a qualified clinical social
14	worker or diplomate in clinical social work by the
15	National Association of Social Workers or as a
16	board certified diplomate by the American Board
17	of Examiners shall be deemed to have satisfied
18	the experience requirements of this
19	subparagraph.]; and
20	(E) In collaboration with the supervisor, may elect
21	to fulfill some or all of the supervision

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1	•	requirements set forth in subparagraph (C)
2		through face-to-face supervision that is
3		conducted electronically through a video
4	•	conference service that is compliant with all
5	,	federal and state privacy, security, and
6		confidentiality laws, including the Health
7		Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of
8		1996. Prior to making such an election, it is
9		incumbent upon the applicant to review the laws
10		and rules of other jurisdictions to determine the
11		impact, if any, that electronic supervision may
12		have on license by endorsement in other states."
13	SECTION 3	. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
14	and stricken.	New statutory material is underscored.
15	SECTION 4	. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
