A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO VETERANS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that currently, South Korean veterans of the Korean War are allowed to have "Veteran" 2 3 status printed on their Hawaii license plates to reflect their 4 The legislature further finds that the same privilege 5 should be extended to the driver's licenses and civil 6 identification cards of South Korean veterans of that conflict. 7 SECTION 2. Section 286-109, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 8 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:
- "(a) Upon payment of the required fee and upon
 demonstrating the ability to operate a certain category or
 categories of motor vehicles to the satisfaction of the examiner
 of drivers, an applicant for a driver's license shall be issued
 a single license of a design approved by the director of
 transportation upon which is made a notation of:
- 15 (1) The category or categories of motor vehicles the applicant may operate;

1	(2)	Any restrictive provisions to which the license is
2		subject;
3	(3)	Veteran status, if desired by the applicant; provided
4		that the notation shall be on the front of the license
5	,	and shall not include any designation other than the
6		term "veteran"; and
7	(4)	When the license is issued to a person under twenty-
8		one years of age, a statement, in clearly legible
9		print that shall contrast with the other information
10		appearing on the license, which indicates the date on
11		which the person will attain the age of twenty-one
12		years.
13	As used i	n this subsection, "veteran" [means any person who
14	served in	any of the uniformed services of the United States and
15	was discharged under-conditions other than dishonorable.] shall	
16	have the same meaning as in section 286-305."	
17	SECTION 3. Section 286-305, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is	
18	amended b	y amending subsection (b) to read as follows:
19	"(b)	The examiner of drivers, after obtaining the
20	fingerprint of the applicant as provided in this part and after	
21	obtaining	the information required by or pursuant to this part,

1	shall issue to each applicant an identification card in a form		
2	and with identifying information that the director deems		
3	necessary and appropriate, including a notation of veteran		
4	status, if desired by the applicant, on the front of the card		
5	where applicable; provided that such notation shall not include		
6	any designation other than the term "veteran". 'As used in this		
7	subsection, "veteran" means any person who served in [any]:		
8	(1) Any of the uniformed services of the United States; or		
9	(2) The Republic of Korea armed forces during the Korean		
10	conflict,		
11	and was discharged under conditions other than dishonorable."		
12	SECTION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed		

and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
