A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PUBLIC BUILDINGS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

The legislature declares that this Act does not 2 constitute the establishment of a new program or an increase in service by county, and therefore, is not subject to article 3 4 VIII, section 5, of the state constitution regarding the obligation of the State to share the costs of a mandate imposed 5 6 upon the counties. SECTION 2. Chapter 46, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended 7 by adding a new section to be appropriately designated and to 8 9 read as follows: 10 "\$46- County buildings; gender-neutral restrooms.
