A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO VOTER REGISTRATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The right to vote is one of a citizen's most 2 important rights. In 1959, approximately ninety per cent of 3 registered voters in Hawaii voted in the election that eventually led to statehood. Over the ensuing forty years, 4 5 however, voter-participation rates in Hawaii have fallen. In 6 the most recent general election in 2014, only 52.3 per cent of 7 registered voters cast a ballot. The reasons for the steep 8 decline in voter-participation rates in Hawaii are many and 9 complex. Nevertheless, greater efforts must be made to 10 encourage the people of Hawaii to vote for their leaders. One 11 way is to help young people acquire the civic habit of voting at 12 an early age. If a person begins voting as soon as the person 13 is eligible to do so, that person tends to vote throughout the 14 person's lifetime.

15 The purpose of this Act is to:

16 (1) Require all twelfth-grade students in public schools
17 to register to vote before graduating; and

1 Require the department of education to hold a one-hour (2) 2 class session for all twelfth-grade students in public 3 schools that is dedicated to elections and voting. 4 SECTION 2. Chapter 302A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 5 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated 6 and to read, as follows: 7 "§302A- Voter registration; requirement. (a) The 8 department shall require all students in the twelfth grade in 9 public schools who are eligible to vote to register to vote as a 10 requirement of graduation. 11 (b) The department shall hold a one-hour class session for 12 all twelfth-grade students in public schools that is dedicated to elections and voting. The department may determine the 13 14 content of the class session; provided that instruction about 15 elections and information on the voting process shall be 16 included. The class session shall be held as part of a related 17 field of study, such as social studies, history, or civics. 18 (c) At least five days prior to the class session required 19 in subsection (b), voter registration forms shall be distributed 20 to students. The forms shall be collected from the students during the class session. 21
